Oregon White Oak

This Oregon White Oak is located at the Barlow Trail Dairy across Highway 224 from the Phillip Foster Farm. The tree with its expansive canopy dominates the entrance to the property.

The David Timm family ran a dairy farm on the property from 1970 to 2000.

The tree species is slow-growing and at maturity can reach up to 90 feet with an average lifespan of 95 to 135 years.

This particular Oregon White Oak tree is a stately specimen with a well-protected root system. The trunk is surrounded by a concrete barrier bordered with flower beds. The placement of the barrier allows the roots to be nurtured with natural storm drainage and protection from cars driving over the roots.

This tree is nominated and approved under the Heritage Tree category of specimen.
