Pedestrian — A pedestrian is someone traveling on foot. It could be someone walking or running.

Right of way — If someone has the "right of way," they get to go first in traffic — and other vehicles have to stop for them. **For example:** Trains have the right of way because people and cars have to stop for them.

Intersection — Any place where two or more streets or roads meet.
















































K9 deputies Mik and Nero are back — and this time, they're teaching a young person the basics of bike, pedestrian and road safety!
