<b>1. Introductions/Welcome</b>	Introductions were made.
<b>2. Clackamas County Board of Health Approval</b>	<p>The Board of County Commissioners approved the creation of a Board of Health in September. The Board of County Commissioners will serve as the Board of Health in Clackamas County. Modernization pushes counties to be more active; start directing more attention on policy rather than programs. The B of H will be a governing body to oversee and develop policy and ordinances for oversight of the Local Public Health Administrator and Public Health Division of H3S. A local Board of Health aligns with Oregon's Public Health Modernization standards that encourages the Public Health Division to boldly expand the scope and reach of public health and public policy to address all factors that promote health and well-being, including those related to economic development, education, transportation, food, environment and housing. A local B of H helps to ensure safe, healthy and secure communities for its citizens by developing health and safety policies and ordinances to guide Public Health in fulfilling its mission.</p> <p>Jarett Gilbert offered space at Clackamas Community College for future meetings.</p>

Next planning steps</li></ul>	<p><u>Blueprint for a Healthy Clackamas County</u>: Clackamas County was the first county in Oregon to get its Blueprint approved by its BCC, in June 2018.</p> <p>Grants for Phase I implementation of the Blueprint plan were released in September. Up to \$216,000 is available over a multi-year span. This dollar figure may change each year based on available funding. Grant proposals received in late October will be reviewed in early November. Allison Myers and Ann Cluster volunteered to assist with review of the grant proposals. Michael Anderson-Nathe and Steve Campbell will serve as back-ups.</p> <p><u>BlueprintClackamas.com</u>: The dashboard will be launched at the Clackamas County TEDMED event on December 17<sup>th</sup>. The contract with the vender was just approved and PH staff are working with HCI for the creation of the dashboard, selection of health indicators to be tracked and an outreach plan.
