SEE BALLOT MEASURE _____ AND EXPLANATORY STATEMENT FIVE-YEAR LOCAL OPTION TAX FOR VECTOR (MOSQUITO) CONTROL IN ARTICLES

Clackamas County Vector Control District is responsible for the control of mosquitoes and flies in Clackamas County. District's programs help protect the health of people and animals by limiting the spread of mosquito-borne diseases such as Encephalitis, West Nile Virus and other mosquito-borne diseases.

Renew Five year local option Levy for Vector (Mosquito-Fly) Control

Shall Vector District levy \$0.025 per \$1,000.00 assessed value for preventing mosquito-borne diseases, mosquito control, general operations, and capital projects?

This measure authorizes the District to levy \$0.025 per \$1,000.00 assessed value outside its existing permanent rate each year for five years beginning 2025-2026. This is the same rate requested in 2004, 2009, 2014, and 2019.

This levy will provide funding for finding and controlling the mosquitoes that cause mosquitoborne diseases, maintenance, general operations, and capital projects including:

- * Funding for potential outbreak of mosquito-borne diseases
- *Continued mosquito control services throughout the County

Estimated tax would cost the owner of a home with an assessed value of \$400,000.00 about \$10.00 per year. Tax is subject to the local government rate limit of Section 11b, Article X1 of the Oregon Constitution.

This is not a permanent rate. This is only for five years and will expire in 2030.

Continued funding will maintain mosquito and fly control programs at their current levels. Details of District operations can be found at the District's website –FighttheBites.com
