## May 16, 2023 Special District Election a Success

- 307,970 Eligible Voters. 29.23% Turnout.
- 501 ballots (0.16%) challenged & could not be accepted because of signature issues.
- Election cost per eligible voter \$1.24.
- Election personnel cost per 1,000 ballots processed \$497.





## November 7, 2023 Special Election

- October 17 Voter
   Registration Deadline.
   Elections office open
   8:30 a.m. 7:00 p.m.
- October 18 Ballots mailed out in new ballot envelopes.




This is **not** a county-wide election. 175,000 eligible voters in cities and local jurisdictions will receive ballots.



## Now Available: Sign Up for Track Your Ballot



Know that your vote counts with simple, secure, mail ballot tracking. Receive alerts via text, phone, or email. Know when your ballot is mailed to you. After you vote and return your ballot, be alerted when it has been accepted for counting. Your vote remains anonymous and confidential.







## May 21, 2024 Primary Election

- September 14 –
   Candidate filing opens.
- April 30 Party Choice
   Deadline and Voter
   Registration Deadline.
- Closed Party Primary: You must be a member of a party to vote in that party's primary election. Every ballot will have nonpartisan offices and measures.


### What's on my ballot?

- Federal and State Offices
  - Closed party primaries for President, Congress and Senate
  - Closed party primaries for State House and Senate
- County Offices or Measures
  - Commissioners (Position 3, 4), Chair (Position 1), District Attorney and Sheriff
  - County measures as referred by the BCC
- Local Offices or Measures
  - Metro Councilor (Position 3)
  - As referred or needed by the local jurisdiction
- Precinct Committee Person (PCP) Party Elections



## November 5, 2024 General Election

- Portland choose their elected city official through Ranked Choice Voting (RCV).
- The City of Portland is located in three counties.
   Multnomah County is the filing officer.
- Clackamas County has 616 registered City of Portland voters (less than 1/5 of 1% of Clackamas County voters).





# Equity and Inclusion

Every eligible voter has the resources they need to vote easily and without barriers.

- Communications and elections resources are being prepared in English and Spanish for the November 7, 2023 Special Election.
- Track Your Ballot service is available in English and Spanish. Text and voice notification options are available to meet individual accessibility needs.
