WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Public and Government Affairs requests the Board of County Commissioners approve the county's 2025 state and federal legislative priorities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Public and Government Affairs (PGA) is tasked with advocating on behalf of the county to state and federal policymakers. PGA uses the Board-approved agendas to guide this work.

The county's state legislative agenda supports continued state/county shared revenue agreements and other funding streams that support major county programs and services. Loss of these revenues would result in potential cuts to county programs and services. The county's federal legislative agenda prioritizes key county programs and projects for potential federal funding and grant opportunities.

In fall 2024, PGA worked with each county department and the three continuing commissioners to identify potential state and federal policy and funding priorities for 2025. PGA also met with the two new commissioners the first week of 2025. Proposed drafts of these priorities are attached.

The 2025 state legislative session will convene January 21, 2025 and adjourn no later than June 29, 2025. The 119th Congress convened January 3, 2025 and is scheduled to adjourn January 2, 2027.

2025 Clackamas County State Legislative Policy Agenda

Clackamas County is urban, suburban, rural, and wild. We are dedicated to welcoming new residents and businesses and committed to delivering community services that are dependable, accessible, and equitable to the public.

COUNTY INITIATIVES

Clackamas County Recovery Campus

Secure \$10 million in additional funding to support the development and construction of the Clackamas County recovery campus, which will increase the number of beds available for substance abuse treatment. In line with our planned recovery-oriented system of care (ROSC), the recovery campus will offer person-centered support, treatment, and resources to help achieve and sustain long-term recovery for individuals overcoming substance use disorders. The county purchased a property for the campus in 2024, and community engagement is underway.

2025 Transportation Package

Advocate for long-term transportation funding that protects the 50/30/20 distribution in the State Highway Fund, funds the projects committed by the state legislature in 2017 without burdening local communities, addresses safety and deferred maintenance projects, and supports housing and job growth. Transportation priorities in 2025 include:

- Completing the HB 2017 commitments, including the I-205 Improvements Project
- Supporting infrastructure investments like the Sunrise Corridor to promote housing and job growth for our fastest-growing cities
- Improving transit ridership and rider connections between urban and rural providers
- Advancing safety improvements in rural communities, including Mt. Hood

COUNTY PRIORITIES

- Advocate for legislation that provides **full cost and predictable revenue**, as well as reasonable liability protection, for local governments providing state-mandated and contracted services. Oppose unfunded or partially funded mandates from the state.
- Advance policies and funding to address the housing and homelessness crisis and to meet housing and employment growth goals. Ensure a balanced approach to land use planning and oppose legislation that limits or erodes local land use authority. Prioritize infrastructure investments that rapidly advance housing production goals.
- Support action to address the impact Measure 110 has had on public safety, homelessness, and our communities and pursue funding for a recovery-oriented system of care, including legislation that separates the deflection program formula from the M110 Oversight and Accountability Council and reconfigures the formula to meet the needs and size of the communities being served.
- Support legislation and funding to reduce PFAS* in the environment and water systems and protect the county from undue liability from pass-through chemicals. Clackamas County is dedicated to protecting public health and the environment.

- Support legislation that creates a **standard statewide process** for county foreclosure surplus claims in response to the Supreme Court decision Tyler v. Hennepin County.

2025 Clackamas County Federal Legislative Policy Agenda

Clackamas County is urban, suburban, rural, and wild. We are dedicated to welcoming new residents and businesses and committed to delivering community services that are dependable, accessible, and equitable to the public.

COUNTY INITIATIVE

Federal funding to support transportation projects.

- I-205 Improvements Project Advocating for federal funding to support construction of the I-205 Improvements Project, which would resolve a congested bottleneck by adding a third lane in each direction on I-205 between Stafford Road and OR 213, including the Abernethy Bridge.
- Identify federal funding opportunities to advance Phase II of the **Sunrise Corridor**, consistent with the community visioning work.
 - $\,\circ\,$ Promote findings from the community visioning work.
- Advocate for federal funding to support the Bull Run Bridge replacement project.

COUNTY PRIORITIES

- Support funding for **housing and human services programs** and other county operations that are reliant on federal resources.
- Advocate for and support the Willamette Falls & Landings area designation as a National Heritage Area (NHA) and improvements to the Willamette Falls Locks.
- Support legislation for the responsible and sustainable management of federal forestlands, including Oregon and California Rail Trust (O&C) Lands, for wildfire prevention and predictable revenue to counties from shared timber receipts.

Clackamas County Legislative Process and Messaging

Legislative Process

For issues covered by the county's legislative agendas (initiatives/priorities/principles):

- PGA coordinates with departments and partners
- PGA updates the Board weekly, if not more frequently depending on legislative action

For issues not covered by the county's legislative agendas (initiatives/priorities/principles) and that require county action:

- If time allows, PGA brings to the Board at a weekly setting
- If time does not allow, PGA convenes a Special Operations Committee to assess issues and determine the county's position so that PGA staff can carry out lobbying activities quickly and effectively. This Committee will be comprised of the County Chair, County Vice-Chair, County Administrator, County Counsel, PGA staff, and the subject-matter department director
- PGA informs the Board of new county positions within the week

Messaging

All legislative messaging (policy statements/letters/testimony) will adhere to the county's legislative agendas (initiatives/priorities/principles) or other Board-approved positions. Any issue not covered by the county's legislative agendas must be vetted through the above legislative process prior to messaging on the topic.

Policy Statements/Letters:

- PGA typically communicates county positions through verbal communications and/or concise policy statements delivered by the county lobbyist. Policy statements will be vetted and approved by PGA, in consultation with appropriate county department directors or designees.
- PGA also may communicate county positions using formal letters signed by the Chair on behalf of the Board. Such letters do not require Board approval providing they adhere to the county's legislative agendas or other Board-approved positions. PGA will consult with County Administration in cases where a different letter format is preferred.
- PGA shares county position statements to the Board within one week of their submission to the legislature.

Testimony:

- Testimony will be produced and/or reviewed by PGA in advance of legislative committee meetings, in consultation with appropriate county department directors or designees.
- Testimony may be given without Board approval providing it adheres to the county's legislative agendas or other Board-approved positions.
- Testimony will be available for review by the Board.

Legislative Letters/Testimony from an Individual Commissioner

- Individual commissioners may sign letters and/or provide testimony in support of or opposition to legislative issues on which the county has not taken a position.
- Individual commissioners should not write a dissenting letter or provide dissenting testimony that is in opposition to the county's legislative agenda or other Board-approved positions.
- Letters/testimony will note the opinion is that of the individual commissioner, not the entire Board.
- Letters/testimony does not need prior approval from the entire Board.
- Signed letter/testimony will be shared with the Board and PGA.
