





Oregon ranked 25<sup>th</sup> in the nation for highest rate for all drug-related overdose deaths in 2022



Nearly half of all Oregon overdose deaths occurred among tri-county residents in 2022



## **Tri-County Deaths by Drug Type and Year**



Data accessed on 10/24/23 through CDC WONDER with **2022 provisional data** using the multiple cause of death query by residence, not occurrence. Synthetic opioids, specifically fentanyl, were not standard in toxicology testing until 2017. Queries are MCD - ICD-10 Codes: Any opioid: (T40.0 (Opium); T40.1 (Heroin); T40.2 (Other opioids); T40.3 (Methadone); T40.4 (Other synthetic narcotics); T40.6 (Other and unspecified narcotics). Stimulants: (T40.5 (Cocaine); T43.6 (Psychostimulants with abuse potential). Synthetic opioids/fentanyl: T40.4 (Other synthetic narcotics). Psychostimulants with abuse potential/meth: T43.6 (Psychostimulants with abuse potential).
