

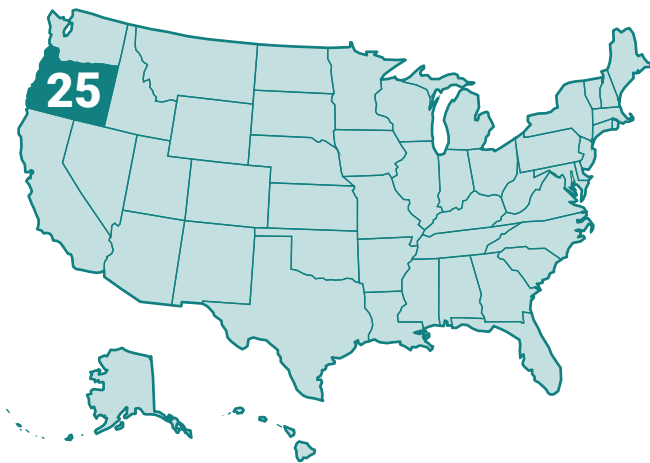

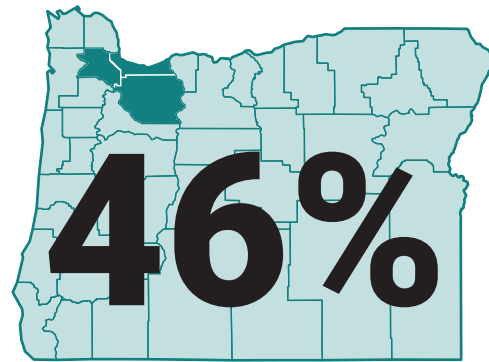

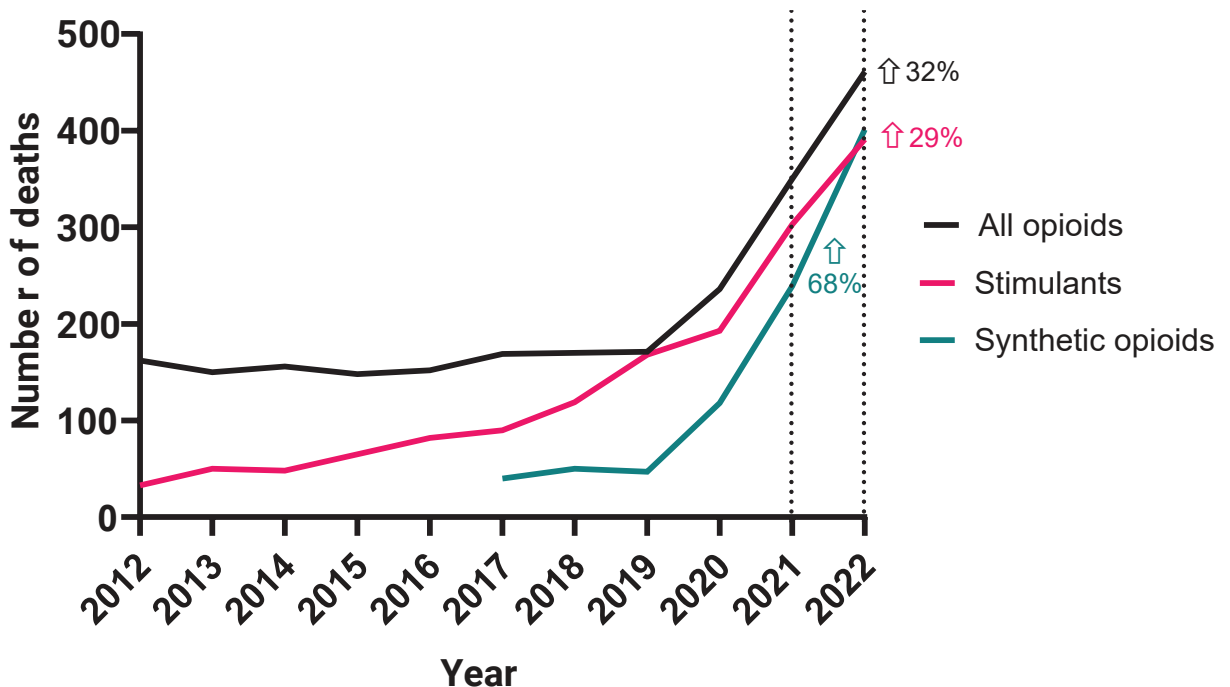
Oregon ranked 25th in the nation for highest rate for all drug-related overdose deaths in 2022



Nearly half of all Oregon overdose deaths occurred among tri-county residents in 2022



Tri-County Deaths by Drug Type and Year



Data accessed on 10/24/23 through CDC WONDER with 2022 provisional data using the multiple cause of death query by residence, not occurrence. Synthetic opioids, specifically fentanyl, were not standard in toxicology testing until 2017. Queries are MCD - ICD-10 Codes: Any opioid: (T40.0 (Opium); T40.1 (Heroin); T40.2 (Other opioids); T40.3 (Methadone); T40.4 (Other synthetic narcotics); T40.6 (Other and unspecified narcotics). Stimulants: (T40.5 (Cocaine); T43.6 (Psychostimulants with abuse potential). Synthetic opioids/fentanyl: T40.4 (Other synthetic narcotics). Psychostimulants with abuse potential/meth: T43.6 (Psychostimulants with abuse potential). Residence location: Clackamas County, OR (41005); Multnomah County, OR (41051); Washington County, OR (41067).
