-WELLS: His community has budget concerns re: S.O. and politically ie: spillover of unrest in PDX into Clackamas.

-HENDRICKS: Shooting on 31<sup>st</sup> of December where 4 people shot @ 92<sup>nd</sup> & Idleman; asking for general debrief on incident from Captain O'Neil.

-CARPENTER: Election tension concerns in his neighborhood; besides this typical issues with increased homeless population.

-CABINE: Homeless campers in area is a concern in addition to what appears to be increase in crime ie: Robbery at Ace Hardware late last year on Sunnyside.

-RHODES: Quiet Neighborhood with nothing new to report.

### **VIII: Reports:**

A. *Regional crime stat data discussion:* Calls for service Q4 reflect overall increase in calls reflecting more similar figures to pre-pandemic figures. Holidays come with own increase in call volume. Q1-Q3 are skewed a bit due to Wildfires and COVID-19.

Question on Child Abuse – Have we noticed increase since start of pandemic? Quantity of cross reports down but quality up; teachers also receiving training on recognizing abuse via ZOOM.

B. Jail Update: Working off OHA limit on number of inmates who can be housed. Extra safety precautions have resulted in zero outbreaks in county jail.

C. Hiring: 5 new applicants forwarded to Backgrounds, 4 have been placed on conditional offer status, 8-10 in initial training; moving forward with hiring using high agency standards; will not lower standards to increase numbers.

-CARPENTER: Question re: hiring timeline for new recruit and lateral. Recruit average is 18-24 mos. and Lateral average is 6 mos.

-LOWE: Question re: finances; O'Neil awaiting final report from County.

*D. Critical Incident Review:*

-Shooting mentioned by Hendricks earlier; occurred at county border; visitors from Multnomah County; CCSO working with partner agencies to complete investigation into incident.

*E. Line of Duty deaths reviewed*

*F. CPO: Community planning organization meetings;* Lowe requested Comstock to compile list of upcoming meetings.

WHITLEY: Speaking to matter of 125K Metro grant for study on Oak Lodge studying ability to establish selves as a city. Concerns about this negatively impacting schools, housing options as well as LE & Emergency Services within ELED.
