- Services: Informal, non-credit learning for adults and youth-designed by the people and for the people-and available to everyone in the county.








Oregon State University Extension Service Clackamas County

- \$2.54 million Extension District tax revenue for FY21 (requested)
- State/OSU faculty Support (county and state) \rightarrow ~\$4 million/year.
- Volunteers–In Kind Service value \rightarrow ~\$2.7 million/year.
- 4-H alone provided 950 Volunteers with 57,049 hours of service \rightarrow ~\$1,450,757.
- Trained and supported over 2,100 Extension volunteers who contributed nearly 106,524 hours of service in informal education and outreach events to the community.
- Grants/Contracts generated by local faculty \rightarrow ~\$1.5 million/year
- Largest county staffing footprint Oregon State University has in Oregon.
- Largest financial support for a County Extension program in Oregon.



- Growing population in Clackamas County, demands and opportunities for education programs and services.
- COVID-19 has brought about innovative opportunities for continued education and services to your community through Facebook live walks in the forest, learning to sew through virtual meeting rooms, Tree School and Master Gardener webinars, and science videos in Spanish for the Latinx youth.
