WHEREAS, during the fiscal year changes in appropriated expenditures may become necessary and appropriations may need to be increased, decreased or transferred from one appropriation category to another;

WHEREAS, a transfer of appropriations of \$50,000 within the Sanitary Sewer Operating Fund for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, is necessary to continue to prudently manage the distribution of those expenditures for the needs of Water Environment Services; and

WHEREAS; the fund being adjusted is the Water Environment Services Sanitary Sewer Operating Fund 631;

It further appearing that it is in the best interest of Water Environment Services to approve this change in appropriations for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF WATER ENVIRONMENT SERVICES, THAT:

Pursuant to its authority under ORS 294.338, ORS 294.433 – ORS 294.481, and ORS 294.900 – ORS 294.930, a transfer of appropriation within the fiscal year budget for Water Environment Services is authorized as shown in the attached Exhibit A, which by this reference is made a part of this resolution.

## BACKGROUND:

Periodically during the fiscal year, it is necessary to transfer appropriations to more accurately reflect the changing requirements of Water Environment Services ("WES").

Transfers are a method of moving budgeted appropriations during the fiscal year as required by state budget law per ORS 294.463. There is no financial impact incurred as a result of transfers as appropriations for these amounts have been accomplished through the initial budget process.

Within WES' service area, the Cities of Gladstone, Happy Valley, and Oregon City assess rightof-way or franchise fees for WES' use of their public right-of-way for sanitary sewer and stormwater infrastructure. These fees are collected by WES on behalf of the Cities and then remitted to the Cities on a pass-through basis under the Special Payments budget category. The original FY 2021-22 budget projected 5% customer growth in the City of Happy Valley. Actual growth in the City for the current fiscal year has been closer to 10% which has resulted in additional right-of-way fees. The attached resolution transfers \$50,000 from the Contingency category to the Special Payments category in WES' Sanitary Sewer Operating Fund to cover the additional right-of-way fees.

These changes are in compliance with Oregon Local Budget Law ORS 294.338, ORS 294.433 - ORS 294.481, and ORS 294.900 – ORS 294.930, which allows for governing body approval of budget changes under qualified circumstances.

The effect of this resolution is a transfer of \$50,000 from Contingency to Special Payments.
