#### WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Is there direction the Board would like to provide District staff regarding the advancement of planned capital improvements to improve streetlighting?

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

District staff met with the Board on April 22, 2014 to discuss options for the use of \$865,089 of additional revenue received from the sale of the District owned "Option B" street lighting and Energy Trust Credit incentive. As a part of this discussion, staff provided a conceptual list of possible capital projects to improve street lighting throughout the County. See Attachment A. At that time, the Board directed staff to coordinate with Portland General Electric to develop a more detailed plan for providing street lighting on McLoughlin and refine the estimated capital and operational costs for all proposed projects.

The following paragraphs expand on the results of staffs work to date.

#### 1. McLoughlin Boulevard Lighting Improvements

The District currently has a conceptual plan and is working collaboratively with PGE towards a final plan for installing street lighting for the Mcloughlin Blvd. frontage. The plan includes street lighting on both sides of Mcloughlin Blvd stretching from Park Ave. to the north to the Gladstone city limit to the south. The plan assumes a mix of pole types to maximize the use of existing facilities and minimize cost. The following is a general scope of the project:

Next Steps: As outlined in the Financial Implications below, there are insufficient capital funds to advance this project at this time. In order to develop a viable project the following needs to occur:

 Capital Funding Shortfall – To address the issue of insufficient capital funds, additional sources of funding, such as regional grants, need to be secured or the project scope needs to be reduced. With Board concurrence, staff could work with local interested parties to assess of viable grant funding and update the Board at a future date on the results of this effort.

In the event no other sources of funding are available, staff will coordinate with local interested parties to assess options to reduce project scope.

Petition / Operational Funding Shortfall – Once the issue of capital funding is addressed
there is still the issue of the necessity to annex those properties bordering McLoughlin
Blvd. into the district and the adoption of a new rate. These efforts will be the
responsibility of the local interested parties, primarily MAP-IT, to advance these efforts
through the District's standard petition process. Staff will continue, to coordinate and
assist MAP-IT on this effort once the issue of insufficient capital funding is addressed.

#### 2. Idleman Rd. Street Lighting Safety Enhancements

Staff has been coordinating with PGE and the City of Happy Valley to provide street lighting improvements to a portion of Idleman Rd. Costs associated with adding street light fixtures is minimal. In order to determine the financial feasibility we are preparing the scope of work needed which includes some tree trimming and the addition of one or more poles. The cost for this work is not expected to exceed \$20,000 and there are opportunities to partner with funding in Happy Valley to advance this project.

Next Steps: Staff will continue to coordinate with PGE to refine the project scope and cost. With Boards concurrence, the project will be advance to bid and completed as soon as reasonably possible.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS (current year and ongoing):

Staff has prepared a Financial Impact Form for the Boards consideration. See Attachment A. In summary:

Capital Funding Shortfall: Based on preliminary cost estimates there is a funding shortfall of approximately \$500,000, primarily associated with the lighting of McLoughlin Boulevard.

Operational Shortfall: Based on preliminary estimates to operate, the current rate structure for commercial, industrial, and multifamily of \$1.20 per linear foot is insufficient to operate the lighting along McLoughlin Boulevard. Current estimates suggest an annual operating deficit of approximately \$12,000. To meet this need, a new rate for this specific area would be necessary.

#### **PUBLIC/GOVERNMENTAL PARTICIPATION:**

District staff is working closely with Portland General Electric to plan, create and implement the street lighting plan for the McLoughlin Area street lighting plan. Representative from the Mcloughlin Plan Implementation Team (MAP-IT) committee have been consulted and informed throughout the planning process.

QUESTION 1: Does the Board concur with the recommended next steps regarding the identified Capital Improvement Projects?

- Option 1: Board concurs with next steps as outlined above and directs staff continue to advance the identified Capital Improvement Projects.
- Option 2: Board amends the identified next steps and directs staff to advance the identified Capital Improvement Projects consistent with the Boards direction.
- Option 3: Board rejects the recommended next steps and directs staff to advance, or not advance, the identified Capital Improvement Projects consistent with the Boards direction.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff respectfully recommends the Board concur with next steps as outlined above and directs staff continue to advance the identified Capital Improvement Projects.
