Quarantine and Isolation Guidelines for K-12 Students

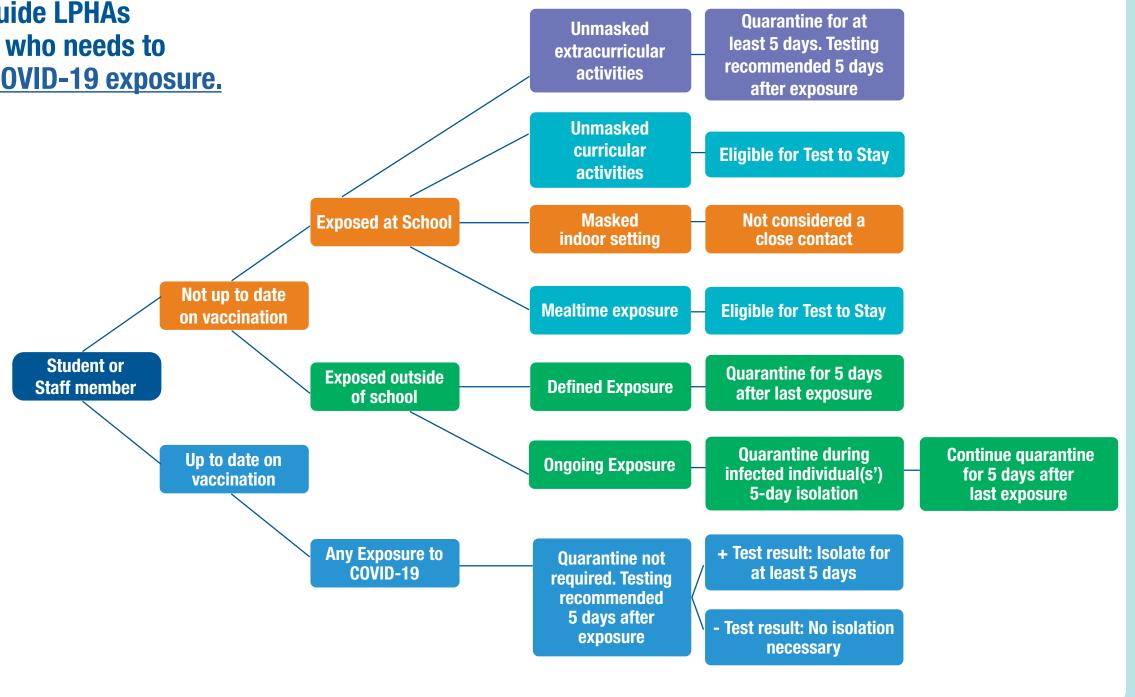
This decision tree is to help guide LPHAs and schools in understanding who needs to quarantine or isolate after <u>a COVID-19 exposure</u>.

Quarantine is for individuals who were exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual but are not symptomatic and have not tested positive. The recommended quarantine length is at least 5 days and masking is required for 10 days following the exposure.

Isolation is at least a 5-day period for people who have tested positive or are symptomatic after being exposed to COVID-19. Individuals are also required to mask for ten days during this period. An individual should continue isolation if symptoms are not improving by day 5.

Testing is recommended for all individuals who are exposed to someone who has COVID-19, 5 days after the date of exposure.

Up to date indicates an individual 5-17 years has completed their primary series of COVID-19 vaccine or an individual 18 and older has received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters if more than 5 months from completing their primary series of Pfizer or Moderna or 2 months from completing their J&J vaccine.





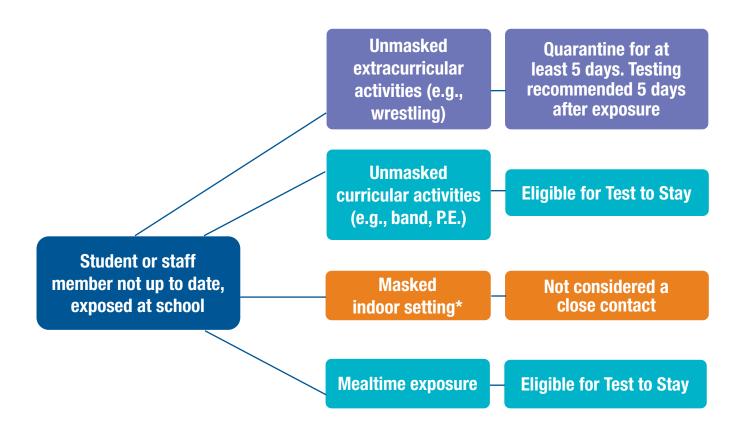

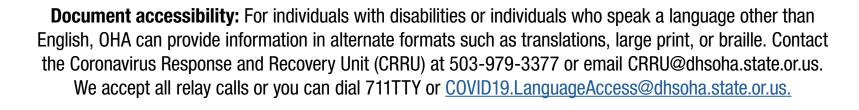
Quarantine Guidelines for Individuals Not Up to Date with School Exposure

Not up to date indicates unvaccinated individuals who have not completed the primary series of any COVID-19 vaccine or individuals 18 and older who completed their primary series of Pfizer or Moderna more than 5 months ago and are not boosted or completed their J&J vaccine over 2 months ago and are not boosted.

*This setting includes the school bus, classrooms, bathrooms, hallways, and school-related extracurricular activities.



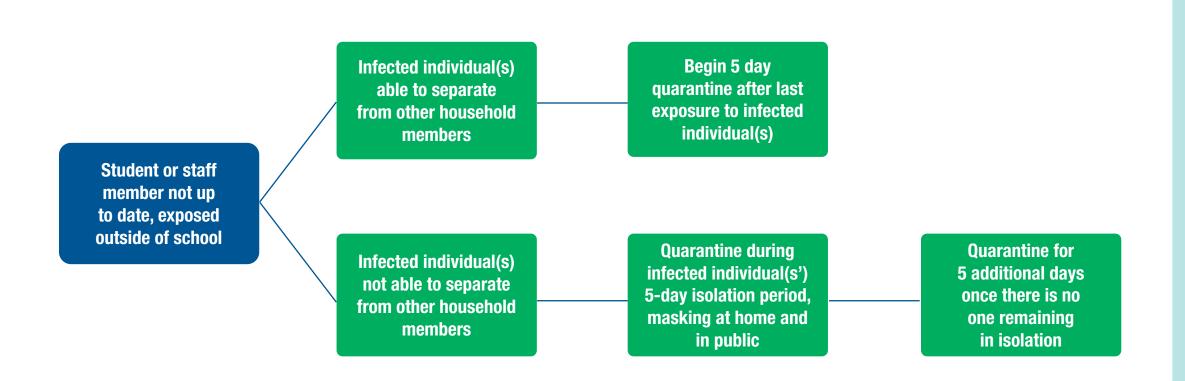






Quarantine Guidelines for Individuals Not Up to Date with Exposure Outside of School

If you are not up to date and someone in your household has COVID-19, you should begin quarantine the day after your last exposure to them or the end of their 5-day isolation period if you are not able to separate. Masking is also required for 10 days following an exposure.



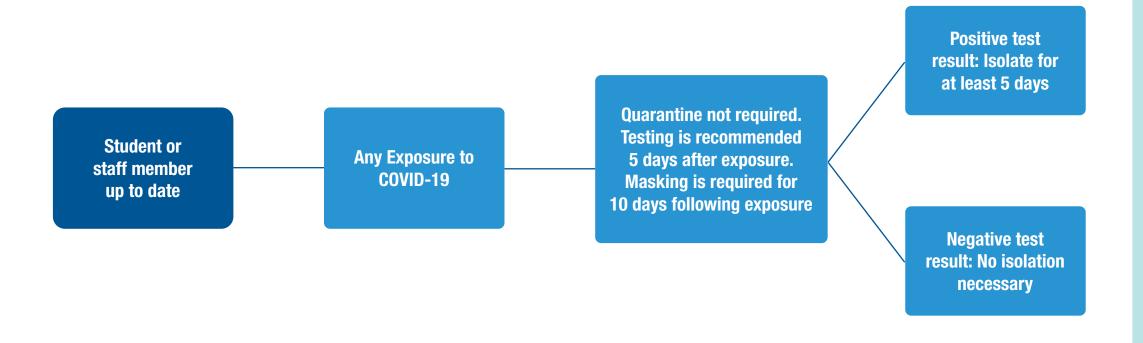

Quarantine Guidelines for Individuals Up to Date in the K-12 Setting

Up to date indicates an individual 5-17 years has completed their primary series of COVID-19 vaccine OR an individual 18 and older has received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters if more than 5 months from completing their primary series of Pfizer or Moderna or 2 months from completing their J&J vaccine.
