F1 = hybrid. Do not save seeds from plants you grow with these seeds. They will not produce the same plant.

L = Locally-grown seed

OSSI = Open Source Seed Initiative. OSSI was created by a group of plant breeders, farmers, seed companies, and sustainability advocates who want to free the seed! OSSI works with plant breeders who commit to making one or more of their varieties available exclusively under the OSSI Pledge. If you see OSSI in a listing, see the "pledge" in the next paragraph

Landrace is a locally-adapted, genetically-diverse, promiscuously-pollinated, survival of the fittest crop that fosters food security and community. It is a blend of many varieties and has incredible vigor. It is highly adaptable to a changing growing environment.

Advantages

- •Adaptability more easily adapts to a changing growing environment than heirlooms, open pollinated, and hybrid varieties
- Easy seed saving you don't have to worry about it crossing with another variety. Crossing is a good thing in a grex or landrace.
- •Community the more we share our grex and landrace seeds with each other, the more genetic diversity we achieve as a community.

Creating your own climate adapting variety (modern landrace)

- •Interplant as many different varieties of the same species as you can.
- •If you like the taste of the produce, save seed from it and replant as many different varieties as you can next year
- •Do not save seed from weak or diseased plants; only save seed from your best plants
- •Give the library some of your seeds so your community can use it
