EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The mission of the Clackamas County Juvenile Department ("CCJD") is to provide equitable juvenile justice, family support, intervention, and reformation services to youth so they can repair harm to victims, experience positive change, and contribute to a safe, healthy, and secure community. This amendment reinstates the 2021-2023 grant agreement #15662 and adds \$459,377 of allocated Juvenile Crime Prevention funds from the Oregon Department of Education, Youth Development Division for the 2023-2025 Biennium. These allocated funds are used, in conjunction with funds from 11 cities throughout Clackamas County to contract Community Diversion Program Services for low risk/low level first time offenders within their communities.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached Grant Award.

Reinstatement and Amendment No. 1 to Grant No. 15662

This is Reinstatement and Amendment No. 1 to Grant Agreement No. 15662, effective July 1, 2023 (as amended from time to time, the "Grant"), between the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Oregon Department of Education ("Agency") and Clackamas County ("Grantee"), each a "Party" and together, the "Parties". Upon receipt of all required approvals and execution by both Parties, this Reinstatement and Amendment shall be effective on July 1, 2023 ("Amendment Effective Date").

The Grant expired on June 30, 2023 and the Parties now desire to reinstate the Grant in its entirety and amend the Grant provided herein.

The Parties acknowledge and agree that Agency has not made any payment for activities performed after June 30, 2023.

The Grant is amended as follows (new language is indicated by **underlining and bold** and deleted language is indicated by **strikethrough**):

1. Section 3 of the Grant is amended as follows:

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION

When all Parties have executed this Grant, and all necessary approvals have been obtained ("Executed Date"), this Grant is effective and has a Grant funding start date as of July 1, 2021 ("Effective Date"), and, unless extended or terminated earlier in accordance with its terms, will expire on June 30, 2023 June 30, 2025.

2. Section 6 of the Grant is amended as follows:

SECTION 6: GRANT FUNDS

In accordance with the terms and conditions of this Grant, Agency will provide Grantee up to \$475,248.00 **\$495,377.00** ("Grant Funds") for the Project. Agency will pay the Grant Funds from monies available through its General Fund ("Funding Source").

3. Exhibit A Section V of the Grant is deleted and replaced with the following revised Exhibit A Section V, effective as of the Amendment Effective Date.

SECTION V. PROJECT EVALUATION/REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Using Agency provided reporting templates, Grantee will submit required reports, related reports and information as Agency may reasonably require. Required reports include Quarterly Reports and the Final Report. Grantee must submit the reports as indicated below:

Except as expressly amended above, all other terms and conditions of the Grant are still in full force and effect. Grantee certifies that the representations, warranties and certifications contained in the Grant are true and correct as of the Amendment Effective Date and with the same effect as though made at the time of this Amendment.
