



NOTICE OF READOPTION OF URBAN AND RURAL RESERVES

Clackamas County, Multnomah County, and Metro have adopted final decisions regarding urban and rural reserves in response to the remand from the Oregon Court of Appeals in *Barkers Five, LLC et al. v. Land Conservation and Development Commission*, 261 Or App 259 (2014) and LCDC's corresponding Remand Order No. 14-ACK-001867.

On May 23, 2017 the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 06-2017, which includes supplemental findings and conclusions explaining why the Stafford area was designated urban reserve under the applicable factors. On June 1, 2017 the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 1246, which includes supplemental findings and conclusions explaining why Area 9D was designated as rural reserve under the applicable factors.

On June 15, 2016 the Metro Council adopted Ordinance No. 17-1405, which incorporates all of the findings adopted on remand by the counties and by Metro into a single joint set of findings and conclusions as required by OAR 660-027-0040(10). The decisions were submitted to the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) for review on July 24, 2017. Together, these decisions respond to the remaining issues identified by the Court of Appeals in the *Barkers Five* opinion, and result in no changes to the map of urban and rural reserves that was jointly adopted by Metro and the two counties in 2011.

If you believe these decisions violate state law that applies to urban and rural reserves, you may object to the Department of Land Conservation and Development. To file an objection, **you must do three things in your written objection:**

1. Show that you participated in the process leading to one of the decisions by speaking or submitting written testimony at a public hearing held by one of the four governments or submitting written comment at one of the workshops or open houses held by one of the governments or sending written comment to one of the four governments.
2. Explain your objection to one of the decisions, being as specific as possible, including the statewide planning goal, the LCD rule, or the land use statute that you believe was violated by the decision.
3. Recommend a specific change that would resolve your objection.

You must also send a copy of your objection to the contacts at all three of the local governments (addresses provided above).

The Department must receive your objection **no later than 21 days** from the date this notice was mailed (see postmark on envelope or date of e-mail).

If your objection does not meet the above requirements, the department will not consider your objection.
