Approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Portland For Homeless Management Information System

The Community Development Division (CDD) of the Health, Housing and Human Services Department requests approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Portland for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). This Agreement would renew an existing IGA and would allow county-based homeless programs to continue to utilize HMIS software and services provided by Portland. (This HMIS system is a regional implementation with Multnomah and Washington Counties participating as well.) Without HMIS participation, the U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will no longer provide funding for homeless programs to jurisdictions.

The total cost from this Intergovernmental Agreement is \$7,888.00. It is effective September 2, 2010 and is ongoing. Clackamas County has secured HUD funds to pay for this HMIS-related IGA. No county general funds are involved.

County Counsel approved this agreement on September 21st, 2010



Approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with City of Lake Oswego For Diversion Panel Services

The Children, Youth & Families Division of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Lake Oswego for Diversion Panel services. This contract will fund a Diversion Panel Coordinator who will assess youth referred by the Juvenile Department, work with the youth to develop Individual Diversion Agreements (IDA) with input from a panel of local community members, and monitor the youth for successful completion of diversion agreement requirements.

We anticipate that 85% of youth participants will successfully complete the IDA and will not be referred for a law violation during the 12 month period after services end.

Total amount of this agreement is \$24,990. Funds are budgeted in the Prevention Services grant stream for fiscal year 2010-2011 to cover this agreement. No County General Funds are involved. This agreement is effective upon acceptance by all parties and will terminate June 30, 2011. This contract is in the format approved by County Counsel as part of the DHS contract standardization project.



Approval of the Clackamas County Commission on Children and Families Self Assessment and Approval of the 2009/2011 Partnership Agreement with the Oregon Commission on Children and Families

The attached documentation represents the findings of a self-assessment exercise completed by the Clackamas County Commission on Children and Families (CCF). Local commissions are required to complete this assessment to qualify for continued funding from the state. Performance was measured on five components of local commission systems:

- 1. Development and implementation of a coordinated, comprehensive plan for children, youth, and families;
- 2. Informing and participating in the development of policies that improve outcomes for children and families;
- 3. Organizing change by mobilizing communities to address local issues;
- 4. Facilitating partnerships and collaborations among a wide range of disciplines to develop and improve systems of service delivery across the age and delivery continuum;
- 5. Improving the quality of service delivery by investing in evidence-based practices, managing CCF resources, and monitoring the effectiveness of services.

Notable activities in these categories include:

- Leveraging over \$1,250,000 (cash) in addition to funding allocated by OCCF (leverage equals 55% of the state budget allocation);
- Funding prevention-based programs and services to 4,894 children, youth, and families;

or Civily Beck

- Actively participating in the planning and development of the Gladstone Center for Children and Families;
- Leading the planning and development of the Family Stepping Stones Relief Nursery which includes securing approximately \$1,000,000 in funding for facility renovation and \$100,000 for operations.

Clackamas County's Commission on Children & Families focuses its efforts on creating infrastructure that maximizes funds/resources and strategically planning and implementing programs and services in local communities to address high risk populations. The hundreds of thousands of dollars entrusted to CCF by the Board of County Commissioners are funneled through CCF processes to promote the leveraging of funds, the use of evidenced-based programming that builds a system of care, thus minimizing the flow of clients into more costly services.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully recommends the Board of County Commissioners approve the CCF Self Assessment and the 2009-2011 Partnership Agreement with the Oregon Commission on Children and Families.

Approval of a Resolution Declaring the Necessity and Purpose for Acquisition of Rights of Way and Easements – Group 1 for the Hwy 212/Connection Phase II Project and Authorizing Negotiations and Eminent Domain Actions

The Board of County Commissioners has approved funding for the Hwy 212/Lawnfield Connection Phase II Project No. DB-32, which will provide for improvements to SE 98th Court from SE Mather Road to SE Lawnfield Road in Clackamas, Oregon. The Board has authority under ORS Chapter 35 to acquire rights of way, easements, and fee property by purchase or condemnation proceedings.

The project has been planned and located in a manner which is most compatible with the greatest public good and which causes the least private injury. The Department of Transportation and Development (Department) shall negotiate in good faith in an attempt to reach agreement as to the amount of just compensation owed each affected property owner. To fairly determine the amount of just compensation, staff will utilize the expertise of authorized real estate appraisers and other such experts.

The Department is in the process of developing the final legal descriptions required for acquisition of rights of way and easements for the properties affected by the Project. This resolution addresses the need and necessity of acquisitions covered under the first group of legal descriptions ("Group 1") available for negotiation. Subsequent groups of descriptions will be provided to the Board for authorization of additional Resolutions. If during the course of the project design/construction modifications should effect acquisitions, staff will bring subsequent revisions to the Board for authorization.

The resolution directs the Department to resolve issues of just compensation through good faith negotiations. It requires the Director of the Department to notify the Board if exercise of the power of eminent domain becomes necessary. Only after this process is completed does it authorize the Office of County Counsel to file a condemnation action.

APPROVAL OF SUPPLEMENT NO. 3 FOR THE COOPERATIVE IMPROVEMENT
AGREEMENT BETWEEN CLACKAMAS COUNTY, CLACKAMAS COUNTY DEVELOPMENT
AGENCY AND OREGON DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (ODOT) REGARDING
ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES
FOR THE MONTEREY AVENUE OVERCROSSING

Clackamas County and the Development Agency entered into a Cooperative Improvement Agreement (CIA) with the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) on March 2, 1995, for the design and construction of Monterey Avenue Overcrossing. The agreement was amended on January 4, 2000, and May 15, 2000, to clarify responsibilities and obligations of each governing body. The agreement expired on May 15, 2002, and the parties would like to revive and amend the agreement.

The scope of the amendments are to address continuing maintenance responsibilities for structural changes to the overcrossing constructed in conjunction with TriMet's I-205 Green Line project. In addition, the amendment references a conveyance of property, owned by the Development Agency, to ODOT. The land to be conveyed currently accommodates the ODOT bike/pedestrian pathway and is illustrated on Exhibit D (attached).

RECOMMENDATION

- Staff respectfully recommends that the Board of County Commissioners, acting on behalf of Clackamas County and the Development Agency Board approve and sign the attached Supplement No. 3.
- Delegate authority to the Board Chair to execute Supplement No. 3, and any future documents relating to the conveyance of the property referenced in Exhibit D, on behalf of Clackamas County and as the Development Agency Board.

APPROVING INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH METRO TO IMPLEMENT THE YEAR 21 METRO AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ANNUAL WASTE REDUCTION PLAN AND THE RECYCLE AT WORK PROGRAM

Metro has approved the County's Waste Reduction Plan for Year Twenty-One (FY11) as required by the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan (RSWMP). Metro redistributes funds earned from disposal of garbage at Metro's owned and franchised facilities. The regional distribution of funds is calculated based on the population (for the Annual Plan) and the number of employees (for Recycle at Work) in each jurisdiction. Cities within the County are eligible recipients of these funds. The County, through a series of agreements, performs the annual responsibilities of the RSWMP as outlined in the Waste Reduction Plan for the Cities of Barlow; Canby, Damascus, Estacada, Gladstone, Happy Valley, Lake Oswego, Milwaukie, Molalla, Oregon City, Sandy, West Linn, and Wilsonville, in exchange for the funds allocated to those jurisdictions by Metro.

Metro is prepared to allocate \$167,063.00 to provide assistance in maintaining the waste reduction programs currently in place throughout the county. Additionally, \$192,835.00 is available to partially fund the Recycle at Work Program. A signed Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Metro is required in order to receive funds. Additionally, Metro requires the County enter into binding agreements with those cities requesting the County perform the services associated with the Plan. The Scope of Work for the Annual Waste Reduction Plan, Scope of Work for the Recycle at Work program, the Year Twenty-One Plan, the agreements with the Cities and the Year Twenty Annual and Recycle at Work Reports are attached. (Attachments A, B, C, D and E respectively).

The intergovernmental agreement form with Metro has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel.

In order to receive the funding, the Board must approve the annual plan and sign the attached intergovernmental agreement.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the Board of County Commissioners approve the Year Twenty-One Plan and Recycle at Work Program and sign the Intergovernmental Agreement with Metro to fund the Programs. Please feel free to call me at 503-742-4466 with any questions.

APPROVAL TO TRANSFER ABANDONED PROPERTY TO THE SEA SCOUTS' CASCADE PACIFIC COUNCIL

The Sheriff's Office receives a sizable amount of property throughout the year that is turned in as found, recovered, or seized during an investigation. Property that is not identified as to ownership or is unclaimed can be transferred to the Sheriff's Office for use or sold at Auction. We are requesting that the usable boat held by our Marine Unit be transferred to the Sea Scouts' Cascade Pacific Council.

Whenever property is found, the Sheriff's Office attempts to locate and contact the rightful owners to return their property to the owner. Any property that is received is held a minimum of three months and letters are sent to any known possible owner.

The 1990 Bluewater Boat identified as abandoned property will be transferred to the Sea Scouts' Cascade Pacific Council. They plan to use the vessel to teach youth about maintenance, safe handling, and operation of boats. The property to be transferred is listed on the attached document.

Approval of a Contract with Ken's Floatation Services Inc. for the Design, Construction and Moorage of a Boathouse for Clackamas County Sheriff's Marine Unit

In January 2009, the County began a project to develop a Facilities Master Plan for Public Safety Operations. The prime objective of the Master Plan was to examine the current space holdings of the Sheriff's Office; create options for consolidation and improved safety and efficiency; prepare a prioritized list of improvements for existing facilities; and then implement options to provide sufficient space to address the Sheriff's Office needs for the next ten years. One of the areas reviewed was the Marine Unit boat storage facility.

The Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Marine Unit currently operates out of the Clackamas Lagoon, located near the junction of the Clackamas and Willamette Rivers. The Unit operates year-round and is experiencing difficulty with operations during low water conditions in the Clackamas River. These low flow conditions occur during the time of year that the waterways receive a significant amount of use by the public. The low water conditions inhibit if not preclude the ability to respond to emergencies from the lagoon location, because of the draft necessary to safely navigate the opening from the lagoon to the Clackamas River. It has been determined that the Marine Unit is in need of a location that can provide year round access to the Willamette and Clackamas Rivers to ensure the ability to respond to emergencies and conduct enforcement patrols.

In compliance with the Clackamas County Local Contract Review Board Rules and ORS 279C the Purchasing Department requested approval to utilize the Request for Proposal process to select the contractor for this project. The required Public Notice was advertised and the findings were presented to the Board and approved in July of 2010. The Request for Proposals was advertised on July 12, 2010 resulting in submission of one proposal on July 29, 2010 from Ken's Floatation Services Inc. The proposal was determined to be responsive and the proposer was determined to be responsible. The Notice of Intent to Award was issued on August 17, 2010. The contract amount is \$282,840 for the design and construction of the Boathouse, plus moorage for a five year term, at the rate of \$685.00 per month.

The Board of County Commissioners, acting as the Local Contract Review Board, may, pursuant to ORS 279C.390, exempt certain contracts from all or a portion of the requirement that good and sufficient bonds be furnished to ensure performance of the contract and payment of obligations incurred in the performance of the contract. In lieu of 100% performance and payment bonds this contract is providing a \$30,000 Public Works Bond issued through the Oregon Bureau of Labor and Industries that is in place to provide surety for payment of labor on the project. Additionally,

the contract calls for retention of final payment in the amount of \$47,000 until a waiver of all liens for labor and materials is submitted and accepted by the County. The retained amount reflects approximately 16% of the total contract value of \$282,840. The customary retention for construction contracts is 5% of the total value of the contract. This exemption was requested by the Contractor due to his inability to acquire traditional Payment and Performance Bonds without significant cost to the project.

Funds for this project will be provided through proceeds from the previous sale of Full Faith and Credit Obligations funding the Sheriff facility projects by the County, and available budgeted funds.

This contract has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board approve the Contract with Ken's Floatation Services Inc. for the Design, Construction and Moorage of a Boathouse for the Clackamas County Sheriff's Marine Unit in the amount of \$282,840 for design and construction plus moorage for a five year term, at the additional rate of \$685.00 per month.

Further, staff respectfully recommends that the Board of County Commissioners, acting as the Local Contract Review Board, exempt this contract from the requirements of Performance Bond and Payment Bonds pursuant to ORS 279C.390 and accept in lieu of said bonds the Public Works Bond in the amount of \$30,000 combined with the retention of final payment in the amount of \$47,000 as sufficient to ensure performance of the contract and payment of obligations incurred in the performance of the contract.

APPROVAL OF AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN
CLACKAMAS COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
AND CLACKAMAS COUNTY SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 1
FOR PILOT STREET SWEEPING SERVICES

Clackamas County Service District No. 1 (CCSD#1) is working with the Department of Transportation and Development (DTD) to increase street sweeping activities in the watersheds that lie within the boundary of CCSD#1. The need to increase the extent and frequency of street sweeping activities on high volume streets was identified as a high priority action item in the 2009 Kellogg Mt. Scott Watershed Action Plan completed by CCSD#1. The purpose of this intergovernmental agreement is to allow DTD and CCSD#1 maintenance staff to work together to develop a pilot street sweeping project that will compare the cost-effectiveness of street sweeping versus catch-basin cleaning on designated roadways within CCSD#1.

Street sweeping activities will be performed by DTD Roads staff and reported to CCSD#1. The reports will be used to determine the cost-effectiveness (miles swept and volume of material removed) of street sweeping compared to the known cost effectiveness of catch-basin cleaning. The duration of pilot project will be fiscal year 2010-2011 with an option to extend.

The cost of the pilot project will be a maximum unit cost of \$120.00 per hour plus a maximum \$15.00 per yard dumping fee. A sweeping frequency of twice monthly (every two weeks) beginning January 1st through September 30th and once monthly from October 1st through December 31st and will be reviewed quarterly. Total project costs will not exceed \$200,000 for the period beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30 2011.

District and County counsel have reviewed the Agreement as to form.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board approve the attached Intergovernmental Agreement between Clackamas County Service District No. 1 and the Clackamas County Department of Transportation and Development for a pilot street sweeping services program.
