

REFILL, RENT, AND REPAIR

Refill: Small actions can make a big difference! Avoid new and single-use packaging by refilling—whether it be food, body care, cleaning supplies, beverages—with containers you already own! Many local stores around the county carry items in bulk and allow you to bring your own container/bag to refill.

REFILL, RENT, AND REPAIR

Refill: using containers you already own! Reuse old plastic/zip-seal bags, cloth, and paper bags, or bring in bottles/jars (when allowed). Avoid using single-use bags to bag your produce and groceries, or bring your own (bonus: make reusable bags out of old sheets or clothes). Utilize deli counters to get cheese and meats in your own container or wrapping. Visit bakeries (in stores or stand-alone bakeries) to avoid plastic as well.
