Dear Clackamas County Voter:

You are holding the largest Voter's Pamphlet ever produced by Clackamas County! There are two reasons for this ninety-two (92) page document. First, nineteen arguments were filed regarding three of the seven measures on the March 11, 1997, ballot. Second, sixty-three of the candidates for district board positions filed candidate statements.

Please remember, your vote-by-mail ballot will contain **ONLY** the measures and candidates for your precinct. This voter's pamphlet has information about candidates for all twenty-six school districts, twenty-one water districts, seventeen fire districts and five other special districts.

A table of contents for measures is on page five. The arguments following each measure are printed in the order in which they were received. A table of contents for candidates begins on page twenty-one.

An elections calendar for the remainder of 1997 is on page 3. Please keep this calendar so you will know when measures must be filed and when the deadlines are for submitting arguments for each election date.

Information about cable access for election night results is on page 20. The address for internet access is on page 90.

This is the first election conducted following the passage of Ballot Measure 47 last November. There is now an additional requirement for certain money measures to be approved. Not only must a majority of people voting approve the measure, there must be at least a 50% turnout of those voters eligible to participate in the election.

We will know the total yes and no vote count later in the evening of March 11. However, it will take a few days for us to determine the actual voter turnout. A measure may "pass" election night, but if fewer than 50% of those eligible to vote actually participate, the measure will not be approved.

BALLOT TITLE

THREE-YEAR LIBRARY OPERATIONS SERIAL LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Clackamas County levy 35¢ per \$1000 assessed value outside the tax base for library operations from 1997-98 to 1999-2000?

SUMMARY: The basic operations of the county-wide library system are funded by a serial levy. The levy allows free use of city and county libraries by county residents. The levy funds the central computer and delivery system which helps libraries share materials throughout the county. The current serial levy is the sole funding source for some libraries and funds between 50% and 97% of the library budget in the others. Libraries use levy money to buy new books, magazines, videos, CDs, reference materials, and to pay for staff and facility costs.

The existing levy expires June 30, 1997. The purpose of this levy renewal is to continue funding for three more years. The proposed levy is 35 cents per \$1000 of assessed property value, or \$35 per year on a \$100,000 house. The levy would begin July 1, 1997, and end June 30, 2000.

This tax is subject to the other governmental purposes limit of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution. The money raised can only be used for library services.

It is estimated that this levy will raise \$8,407,823 in 1997-1998, \$9,385,562 in 1998-1999 and \$10,495,629 in 1999-2000.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Passage of this measure would allow Clackamas County to levy taxes outside the current tax base for three fiscal years, 1997-98, 1998-99 and 1999-2000. The levy would be limited to those three years, and any additional levy would have to be approved by the voters. By law the money raised by the levy could only be used for library services as stated in the ballot title.

County and city libraries are now funded by a three-year serial levy which expires on June 30, 1997. In order to maintain library funding as described below, replacement of the library levy is needed.

In addition to being the sole funding source for the County Library Branches in Oak Lodge and Clackamas Corner, a portion of the levy funds the central shared computer and delivery system that allows libraries share their materials quickly and efficiently throughout the county. A significant portion of the tax money goes back to the cities of Canby, Estacada, Gladstone, Lake Oswego, Milwaukie, Molalla, Oregon City, Sandy, West Linn and Wilsonville to support their libraries. Levy funding will continue to allow residents of unincorporated areas of the county to use these city libraries free of charge.

Libraries use levy money to buy new books, magazines, videos, CDs, talking books, reference materials, on-line resources and to pay for staff and facility costs.

The proposed renewal of the library serial levy will renew county-wide library support for three more years and is based on a fixed rate per \$1,000 of assessed value of property. The proposed rate is 35 cents for each \$1000 of assessed property value, which equals \$35 per year on a \$100,000 house. This fixed rate of 35 cents per \$1,000 is not an increase over the last levy and would stay the same over the three-year life of the proposed levy. The levy would begin July 1, 1997 and end June 30, 2000.

It is estimated that this levy will raise \$8,407,823 in 1997-1998, \$9,385,562 in 1998-1999 and \$10,495,629 in 1999-2000.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

For the past three years the Gladstone Public Library has received, on average, 67% of its funding from the county-wide Library Operations Serial Levy. Because this levy expires on June 30, 1997, it needs to be renewed to avoid significant reductions in library funding. Although the Gladstone Library does not rely entirely on this levy, its loss would mean fewer library services to its patrons. Even with approval of the renewed levy some reduction in funding is possible. The levy proposed for 1997-2000 is at the same rate of 35¢ per \$1,000 of valuation under the expiring levy.

In addition to the direct funding it provides to the Gladstone Library, the levy enables city libraries to participate in a county-wide network. This includes, for example, a central computer and delivery system by which Gladstone patrons have ready access to materials in other public libraries in Clackamas County. Smaller libraries are usually unable to provide the extensive reference services that the county-wide system can offer. The loss of this network would only serve to increase pressure on smaller city libraries, such as Gladstone, at a time when their resources would be significantly depleted.

Public libraries have traditionally had a special place at all levels of our national life. When the British attacked Washington D.C. in 1814, it resulted among other things in the destruction of the Library of Congress and all it contained. Soon after, Thomas Jefferson wrote to Samuel Smith, chairman of the Library Committee of the Library of Congress: "I learn from the newspapers that the vandalism of our enemy has triumphed at Washington over science as well as the arts, by the destruction of the public library..." (Koch & Peden, eds. Writings, 1944). Thereupon, Jefferson offered his private library to begin the rebuilding process. We are not faced with prospects nearly so calamitous today, but it is well to consider how much importance Jefferson assigned to libraries open to the public.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

Libraries in Clackamas County are in trouble right now, faced with cuts in funds from former sources such as city budgets. If the current library levy fails, many of the services citizens expect from their libraries will no longer be available. Already funding problems have curtailed some services and the hours those services are available.

Voting for the library levy can at least assure libraries will stay open. The levy is simply the renewal of an existing tax. It is nothing new, but must be renewed every three years by the voters.

Citizens of Clackamas County have always supported their libraries, but Measure 47 makes it necessary to have a 50% return of ballots of registered voters for this measure to pass. If only 49% of the ballots are sent in and 90% of those sent favor the levy, it will not pass. This can result in closure of libraries and branches, cuts in services offered by libraries able to remain open, and a huge cutback in the ability to provide up-to-date materials.

BALLOT TITLE

FIVE-YEAR OPERATING SERIAL LEVY FOR FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES.

QUESTION: Shall West Linn levy \$1,181,607 each year for five years outside tax base for fire and emergency services beginning 1997-98?

SUMMARY: Currently, seven firefighters and a part-time clerk position in West Linn are paid for through a three-year serial levy that expires on June 30, 1997. The proposed serial levy allows the City to retain the seven firefighters and add at least seven more firefighters over the next five years. The proposed levy will also allow the City to convert the part-time clerk position to full time.

The levy will pay for wages, bertefits, uniforms, equipment, training and other services for these employees and other employees in the department. The levy will also fund safety programs. It this measure is approved, West Linn will be authorized to levy a total amount of \$5,908,035 over a five year period.

This tax levy is subject to the limits of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and the revenues raised will be used for governmental purposes other than schools, Approval of this measure will cause property taxes on West Linn properties to exceed the limits of Article XI, sections 11g(1) and (2)(a) of the Oregon Constitution.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

West Linn Fire Levy Election Facts

Q. How many firefighters does West Linn have?

- A. The West Linn Fire Department has 15 firefighters. The city's general fund pays for 8 firefighters; the other 7 are funded by a three-year levy that expires on June 30, 1997.
- Q. How does our fire department compare with other Oregon
- A. West Linn, with a population of 19,960, has one fire station staffed 24 hours a day, plus one rescue unit that is staffed 40 hours a week. This compares with 4 full-time fire stations in Lake Oswego (population 34,005), 2 full-time stations in Milwaukie (population 20,065), and 2 in Oregon City (population 20,410).

Q. What will the proposed fire levy pay for?

- A. It will allow the city to keep the 7 firefighters/emergency medical technicians funded by the current levy.
- It will allow the city to add 7 firefighters/emergency medical technicians so the department can staff a second fire engine 24 hours a day.

Q. Why are more firefighters requested?

- A. In 1991, West Linn's population was 17,610 and the fire department responded to 874 calls. In 1996, the population was 19,960 and there were 1,193 calls. In 1996, there were delays in responding to emergencies. To provide a timely response to emergency calls now and in the future, the city is proposing to staff a second fire engine 24 hours a day.
- Q. How much will the proposed levy cost? How long is it? What will it cost me?
- A. The levy is for five years, beginning July 1, 1997. It will collect \$5.9 million over the five-year period, or \$1,181,607 per year. Tax rates per \$1,000 assessed value are estimated to be 71 cents in the first year, declining to 48 cents in the fifth year.

This measure would authorize a tax levy outside the limits imposed by Measure 47.

FIVE-YEAR OPERATING SERIAL LEVY FOR WEST LINN POLICE SERVICES.

QUESTION: Shall West Linn levy \$940,486 each year for five years outside the tax base for police operations beginning in 1997-98?

SUMMARY: Currently, seven police officer positions in West Linn are paid for through a three year serial levy that will expire on June 30, 1997. The proposed serial levy allows the City to retain the seven police officers and increase staffing levels by hiring at least five more police officers over the next five years.

The levy will pay for the salaries and benefits of the officers. It will also pay for certain materials, services and equipment for the officers who provide police services for the City. If this measure is approved, West Linn will be authorized to levy a total amount of \$4,702,430 over a five year period.

This tax levy is subject to the limits of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and the revenues raised will be used for governmental purposes other than schools. Approval of this measure will cause property taxes on West Linn properties to exceed the limits of Article XI, sections 11g(1) and (2)(a) of the Oregon Constitution.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

West Linn Police Levy Election Facts

Q. How many police officers does West Linn have?

- A. The West Linn Police Department has 24 officers. The city's general fund pays for 17 officers; the other 7 are funded by a three-year levy that expires on June 30, 1997.
- Q. How does our police department compare with other Oregon cities?
 A. According to most recent figures (1994), among the 22 Oregon cities that are in West Linn's population group (10,000 to 33,000 people), West Linn has the fewest police officers per 1,000 population.
 - Q. What will the proposed police levy pay for?

A. It will allow the city to:

- Keep the 7 officers funded by the current levy.
- Add, on average, one officer per year for the next five years.
- Provide some materials and services used by the officers.
- Replace police vehicles (average 1.5 per year) after 100,000 miles.

Q. Why are more police officers proposed?

A. Between 1989 and 1995, West Linn added 4 police officers – a 22% increase. During the same years:

· Arrests increased 115%.

- Reported crimes increased 87%
- Calls for services increased 125%.
- Population increased 36%.

Q. What police services are provided?

- A. Police services include emergency response, traffic safety, neighborhood patrol, drug education, school liaison, and crime investigation. The levy would provide resources to maintain present levels of service as the population increases.
- Q. How much will the proposed levy cost? How long is it? What will it cost me?
- A. The levy is for five years, beginning July 1, 1997. It will collect \$4.7 million over the five-year period, or \$940,486 per year. Tax rates per \$1,000 assessed value are estimated to be 56 cents in the first year, declining to 38 cents in the fifth year.

This measure would authorize a tax levy outside the limits imposed by Measure 47.

BALLOT TITLE

PERMITS WILSONVILLE TO IMPLEMENT ROAD UTILITY FEE FOR STREET MAINTENANCE

QUESTION: Shall the city of Wilsonville collect a road utility fee to replace property tax levies used for street maintenance?

SUMMARY: Road utility fee raises not more than \$500,000 annually (adjusted to Portland's CPI) for street maintenance and reconstruction. Replaces expiring serial levy of \$0.17/\$1,000 ACV outside the city's tax base.

Estimated monthly fee: Apartment building: Single-family home:

\$1.70 per unit \$2.62

\$2.76-\$1,676

The fee shall be apportioned based use. Use determined by on engineering standards for trip generation and/or vehicle weight classification. Undeveloped properties, SMART, public schools and places of worship that generate traffic primarily on the weekend are exempt.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Wilsonville has historically funded street maintenance and reconstruction with property tax serial levies in the amount of approximately 50¢ per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, raising about \$300,000 annually. In 1993, voters defeated a levy request for street maintenance. As a result, all contracted street maintenance projects were canceled. In 1994, the City Council referred to the voters a levy request of 17¢ per \$1,000, and promised to identify a non-property tax source of funding for street maintenance. Voters approved that levy and the money was used for three emergency projects: Repair of the Wilsonville Road bridge at Boeckman Creek; repair and slurry seal of French Prairie Road; and an overlay of Wilsonville Road from Brown Road to the city limits. The levy, which expires this year, cost the owner of a \$180,000 home \$30.60 per year.

For nearly three years, the City Council has explored numerous alternatives for street maintenance funding. With input from the Budget Committee and a citizen task force, the Council has endorsed a road utility fee that would apportion street maintenance costs among Wilsonville residents and businesses based on the amount of traffic generated. In the case of commercial and industrial land uses, the number of employees and/or building square footage and/or vehicle (truck) weight classifications are factored into the fee formula. The road utility fee would raise not more than \$500,000 annually (adjusted to Portland's CPI) for preventive maintenance and repair. The most cost-effective program for maintaining a safe, functional street system is estimated to cost a minimum of \$436,00 annually, based on a street-by-street survey of pavement conditions.

About 70% of the fee revenue would come from business, since businesses generate most of the traffic in the city and virtually all of the truck traffic. Because most Wilsonville businesses are small, a majority would pay an estimated \$8.17/month or less. A business that generates a lot of traffic but which has few employees, such as a full-service restaurant, would pay an estimated monthly fee of \$209.08. Large employers such as Mentor Graphics or Tektronix would pay an estimated monthly fee of \$890.34. The city's largest traffic generator – the Incredible Universe – would pay the maximum monthly fee of \$1,676 (estimated). A home business would be billed only as a home, in order to avoid "double dipping." A single-family home would pay an estimated monthly fee of \$2.62, or \$31.44 per year.

Undeveloped properties would be exempt from the fee, since such properties generate no traffic. South Metro Area Rapid Transit and public schools would be exempt, since their bus systems have the net effect of reducing traffic on city streets. Places of worship that generate traffic primarily on weekends would be exempt, since the fee is based primarily on average weekday traffic generation estimates.

The fee would appear as a separate item on bi-monthly utility bills.

ARGUMENT AGAINST

The Wilsonville Chamber of Commerce opposes the Wilsonville Road Utility fee for the following reasons:

1. Replacing a voter approved tax levy with a "fee" eliminates future voter's rights to vote on road maintenance taxes.

Once this ballot measure becomes law the city no longer has to come to the voters and can raise the "fee" administratively at any time because it is no longer defined as a tax.

- 2. Disguising this tax by hiding it in the water bill as a "road utility fee" further removes voters and residents from having any direct knowledge of total road maintenance costs or associated city expenses without extensive accounting skill.
- This is a confusing, poorly drafted law and how the "fee" is to be assessed was still being amended by the city staff as they placed this measure on the ballot.
- 4. This is a desperate measure by the city to find a loop hole and bypass voter scrutiny. The people have spoken and continue to demand spending accountability at the ballot box.

The Wilsonville Chamber of Commerce wants well maintained roads and protection of the citizen's investment with economical public accountability. The city council has refused to thoroughly examine other accountable funding mechanisms when holding public hearings on this matter.

Ask yourself before voting, do <u>you</u> benefit from less accountability with hidden "fees" and costs in government.

Why are the city's own buses exempt from this tax? The City, once again, would like to be exempt from their own laws. According to Clackamas County, heavy single axle vehicles like buses cause more damage to residential and secondary roads faster than any other source.


How much does the city really spend on roads? It has not been widely reported that the city currently receives \$450,000 in state funding to repair cracks, potholes, etc. This new tax is an additional \$436,000 and would not be used for those type of repairs nor the construction of new roads.

Is this the best plan the City and it's Task Force could come up with? No, it is the only plan. The Task Force was directed to create a NEW funding source that was not based on property values and not to address the budget or reallocate funds. The city has refused to fully explore other feasible options.

We believe the roads need maintenance, but new and higher taxes disguised as fees are not right. Tell the City to prioritize spending and stop coming up with new ways to tax its citizens.

NORTH CLACKAMAS SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION

QUESTION: Shall the District be authorized to contract a general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$81,946,338? If the bonds are approved they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limitations of Section 11b, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY: Approval will authorize the District to issue general obligation bonds. The proceeds of the bonds will be used as follows:

Construction	47.1%
Reconstruction	38.9%
Safety Mandated Improvements	4.6%
Federally Mandated Improvements	3.4%
Building Wiring Improvements	5.1%
Land Acquisition	0.9%

Cost of issuance will be paid from the bonds, which will mature over a period of not to exceed twenty (20) years. Bonds may be used only for capital construction and improvements. Operating expenses, such as teachers' salaries, can not be paid for from bond proceeds.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Equal educational opportunities for all students

North Clackamas Schools need voter approval of Measure 389 to achieve these goals:

- Renovate aging schools to create comparable opportunities for all students (47 percent of bond).

Preserve the Value of Our Schools and Community

North Clackamas Schools began preparing this bond in 1993. It has been changed to meet concerns expressed in community meetings and at the polls. Hundreds of citizens helped make sure this proposal meets the needs of the community and students. A citizens committee will monitor progress and make sure all projects are completed.

To pay off the \$81.9 million in bonds over 20 years, a consistent rate of 93 cents per \$1,000 (about \$7.75 per month on a \$100,000 home) guarantees that new residents pay their fair share to solve problems created by new growth. By law, bond proceeds cannot pay for school operating costs, such as employee salaries.

BALLOT TITLE

DISCONTINUE LOCAL SCHOOL COMMITTEES

QUESTION: Shall the 3-member elected Local School Committees be discontinued in Centennial School District?

SUMMARY: Local school committees date back to the early 1900s, when rural schools were consolidated into larger school districts. The committees' limited responsibilities – determining what groups can use a school, recommending the hiring and firing of teachers, and reporting to the board once a year – are largely being accomplished in other ways as a result of state law and district policy. Centennial is one of only nine districts in the state that still has local school committees.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

A majority of Local School Committee members agreed at meetings in 1995 and 1996 that their legal duties were no longer meaningful and the groups should be eliminated. State law requires that a majority vote is needed to officially discontinue local school committees.

The Centennial School Board favors replacing the Local School Committees with Principal's Advisory Committees in each school.

Principal's Advisory Committees would be locally controlled rather than controlled by state law. Also, they could open membership to more people and establish agendas based on parents' interests and school needs.

Among the reasons for discontinuing the local school committees:

Out of date:

Local School Committees' legal responsibilities are very narrow in scope. Furthermore, all local school committee duties have been absorbed by other groups, as a result of state law and district policy.

For example: The committees are responsible for determining use of school property for civic purposes other than education. However, rules governing school use are defined in district policy. No major decisions need to be made other than scheduling. Scheduling decisions are more efficiently made by a principal or someone familiar with activities at the school.

A principal's advisory committee would not have state-imposed responsibilities. Because they would be locally controlled, the principal's advisory committees could establish agendas based on the parents' interests and the school's needs.

· Few Candidates, limited membership:

Vacancies on local school committees are difficult to fill because so few people are interested in running for a position that has so little meaning. Membership is limited to three. A principal's advisory committee would have a minimum of six parents representing different grade levels.

· Costly Elections:

The district must pay for a local school committee election every two years, even if no one chooses to run for the office. Eliminating Local School Committees would cut the cost of an election by at least a few thousand dollars. The exact savings varies, depending on how many items are on the hallot

If this measure passes, the School Board would replace Local School Committees with principal's advisory committees. The advisory committees would be open to broader membership and would provide a less expensive and more meaningful way for parents to participate in schools.

BALLOT TITLE

ELIMINATION OF LOCAL SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

QUESTION: Shall the Tigard-Tualatin School District eliminate Local School Committees and the cost of electing them.

SUMMARY: Oregon law requires all schools to form Site Councils which include elected parent representatives. The legislature has given Site Councils broad responsibilities which supercede the advisory role once performed by Local School Committees. This measure would permit each school to replace its Local School Committee with an advisory committee made up of the elected parent representatives from the school Site Council.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This measure is on the ballot in response to a survey of parents who serve on Local School Committees. Overwhelmingly, they support the elimination of the Local School Committees.

Why? Because the 1995 Oregon Education Reform Act created site councils which include peer election of parent representatives. Because site councils have become the main decision-making body in the school, Local School Committee members are playing a lesser and, in some cases, a duplicate role.

Additionally, Local School Committees require <u>formal elections</u>. It is becoming increasingly difficult to find candidates to run for these offices. Consequently, some committees do not have a full slate of candidates and interest is waning due to the popularity and authority of site councils. And, the cost of elections for Local School Committees is now viewed as an unnecessary burden on the district's budget.

Because Local School Committees were part of the district's consolidation vote in 1969, Oregon law requires voter approval to eliminate these committees.

Therefore, if this change is approved by voters, the three-member Local School Committees would be eliminated. Parent participation would, however, continue via site councils. And, in order to provide confidential advice and feedback to school administration, district policy would require regular, private meetings between site council parents and the principal.





During the past year, concerned parents have spoken to me regarding the departure from the teaching of "basic skills" in the West Linn/Wilsonville School District. The common thread through all these conversations is that every one of their children's standardized test scores had declined significantly and these parents voiced a real concern about the long term effects on their children's future.

Having a child at each level in elementary, middle school and high school, I have seen a myriad of changes across the K through 12 grade range. While change can be good, the dramatic shifts in curricula, teaching techniques, and scheduling that is occurring in our schools is alarming. These changes are resulting in less than satisfactory student achievement in many academic areas. A team of parents and myself held meetings over the summer and fall with the District Administration and School Board to work toward solutions to these problems.

The passage of ballot measure 47 and the subsequent decrease in state funding of our schools makes it imperative that our schools become efficient in academic instruction. Many of the needs voiced by parents would make our public schools more effective. These include the need for:

Basic skills at all levels including phonics, spelling, grammar and math computation.

Curriculum continuity across the district.

More emphasis on direct instruction.

A class schedule that gives the student more instructional time. Improved communication between the school district and the community.

We must ensure our children receive the key skills they need to be successful in school and the workplace. The responsibility of our children's future belongs to all of us.




