One of the areas where funding will be increased is in Mobile Crisis and crisis stabilizations centers. Clackamas County has an opportunity to look at how we can respond and expand services.

Wants to get even more tracking regarding drug overdose. Lucy-Discussed about access to insurance and waivers. Mary-Reviewed what this waiver OHA is talking about and what it is for. Teresa-Talked about an experience she had in a store and how security has been told that because of COVID people responses are heightened and just to accept it and that law enforcement will not have the manpower to respond to assault crimes. Adam-added about how now is the time to increase the funding to reform law enforcement to help them deal with the inevitable increase of people hostile behavior from people and not go back to the violent response from police.
