WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Staff requests approval of the 2015 Small Grants recommendation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners approved \$250,000 in the 2015/16 FY budget process to fund the 2015 Small Grants Program. This is an increase of \$50,000. This is the seventh year of the program. The goal of these funds is to support community programs that target the County's most vulnerable populations with innovative projects meet that their basic needs such as food assistance and abuse prevention. Preference is given to those who meet the following criteria:

- Prevent occurrence of larger, more dire problems later;
- Save money later through early intervention;
- Serve people throughout the community.

For the 2015 cycle, Administration staff, Public and Government Affairs (PGA) and Technology Services (TS) worked diligently to increase awareness and access to the Small Grants website and application process. Five videos featuring past recipients were filmed, posted on the grants website, featured on the County's government channel and televised during the Business Meeting. TS created an online form that allowed applications to be submitted and received instantaneously. Staff continued to work with organizations that were unable to submit an online application by accepting the traditional written materials.

90 applications were received with a total request of \$725,096.40. This is an increase from 88 applications received last year but a decrease in the amount requested which totaled \$875,887. A committee was formed to review the applications and determine the attached recommendations (see attachment 1). The committee included Caroline Hill, Small Grants Coordinator – County Administration; Mary Jo Cartasegna, Commissioner Policy Coordinator; Krista Weatherford, Department of Employee Services and Rick Nys, Department of Transportation and Development.

Information was distributed to committee members in August for review prior to three subsequent meetings on September 3, 14 and 28. The focus was to ensure that the monies were dispersed as evenly as possible throughout the County and to impact diverse groups (see attachments 3 and 4). Here are some highlights from this year's requests:

- Small Grants outreach results Increased promotion by PGA and TS resulted in 36% of the requests being submitted by new applicants.
- Food requests Food requests from multiple agencies (big and small) were received totaling \$95,060.40, an increase from \$73,278 in 2014. After careful consideration the committee has recommended fully funding requests focused on the purchase of food.
- Increase in creative approaches Many applications for projects that showed a
 creative approach to the needs of the County were received. An example of this is
 Rivers of Life Center's application. The project works together with multiple
 organizations to provide temporary employment to the homeless or those at risk of
 becoming homeless and will deploy them to multiple heritage areas in the County to
 perform maintenance.

Today staff is seeking Board approval of the recommendation (see attachment 1) so that distribution of funding can occur.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS (current year and ongoing):

\$250,000 from the general funds is already budgeted in the 2015/16 FY budget.

The 2015 Small Grants Program was opened to the public on July 1, 2015 and remained open until August 17, 2015. During that time:

- A press release to media and interested parties went out inviting organizations to apply.
- An email announcement was sent out to all past applicants.
- The Board announced the program during several Business Meetings.
- The Small Grants webpage was updated to include an online application to increase access for our potential applicants.
- Finally, five testimonial videos featuring previous year's recipients were created by the Cable office and displayed during a Business Meeting, the Small Grants web page and were regularly aired on the County's cable channel.




