WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Staff requests approval of the 2018 Small Grants Recommendations.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners approved \$300,000 in the 2018/19 FY budget to fund the 2018 Small Grants Program. This is an increase of \$50,000 from the previous year. This is the tenth year of the program. The goal is to support agencies that are making an effort to develop and implement innovative projects that would help the County's most vulnerable families, seniors, and others meet their basic needs such as food assistance and abuse prevention. Preference is given to those who meet the following criteria:

- Prevent occurrence of larger, more dire problems later;
- Save money later through early intervention;
- Serve people throughout the community.

For the 2018 cycle, Administration staff, along with Public and Government Affairs (PGA) and Technology Services worked diligently to increase awareness and ease of use of our website and application process. We continued to use the online application which has demonstrated to be an effective and easy way for organizations to turn in their applications, although we also provided an application in Word format for those organizations that do not have the technology to submit it online.

We received 111 applications for a total request of \$1,140,834.50. This is an increase in both applications and total amount requested. Last year there were 71 applications which totaled \$730,830.69. Of the 111 applications, 48 were new applicants. This is a result of the increase in funds and PGA's aggressive and effective campaign outreach.

A committee was formed to review the applications as well as past small grant awards and current funding from other County departments to determine the attached recommendations (attachment 1). The committee included Caroline Hill, Small Grants Coordinator; Emily Klepper, Commission Policy Advisor; Mark Sirois, Health, Housing and Human Services; Trish Elmer, Community Corrections; and Jeff Aldridge, Grants Manager.

Information was distributed to committee members in August for review prior to two subsequent meetings on September 17 and September 26. As we worked through each application our focus was to make the Equity Pilot Areas a priority while at the same time ensuring that the monies were dispersed throughout the County and to impact diverse groups.

Today we are seeking approval from the Board of the recommendations in attachment 1.
