INTRODUCTION

Clackamas County Health, Housing & Human Services Department through its Children, Family & Community Connections Division is seeking Grant Applications from multiple agencies/organizations that are capable of delivering Evidence-Based Parent Education services. The funding source for this opportunity is Oregon Community Foundation. Up to \$65,000 is available for early childhood (birth to 6 years old) parenting series. Up to \$30,000 is available for parenting series targeting parents of elementary and middle school aged children. (7 to 14 years old).

GOAL

The goal of this funding opportunity is to provide **evidence-based parent education class series' to parents of children ages birth to 6 years and parents of children ages 7 to 14 years old, who are living in Clackamas County** (see Exhibit B: Approved Curricula). Several evidence-based curricula are available to check out from the Clackamas Community Learning Library at no charge (see Exhibit A: Learning Library).

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Eligible applicants are nonprofit organizations, schools, or public entities serving residents of Clackamas County. Eligible projects must address goals identified above and result in positive, measurable outcomes for Clackamas County residents.

Successful applicants will meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrate capacity and willingness to provide evidence-based parent education services to a variety of Clackamas County populations, including, but not limited to those who are English language learners, low income, living in rural communities, or who are otherwise traditionally underserved;
- Commit to conducting **a minimum of three separate class series** over the funding period. Proposals for additional parenting series are allowed, see expectations below.
- The County expects applicants to commit to conducting a minimum of 2 parenting series aimed at serving parents of children birth to 6 years old. Additional parenting series may serve parents of children birth to 6 **or** parents of children 7 to 14, based on community need and organizational capacity.
- There are no cost-sharing/matching requirements on this award.

FUNDING CYCLE

- Projects may begin no sooner than July 1, 2019.
- Projects must be finalized by June 30, 2020 unless an extension is granted through a grant agreement amendment.
- Final report will be due no later than July 8, 2020

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS

- Funding to individuals is not allowed
- Applications must propose serving parents/caregivers of children ages birth to 14 years old who reside in Clackamas County
- Capital and operating expenses must be clearly outlined for each proposed project.
- Projects proposing use of parenting curricula that is not evidence-based will not be considered.
