WHAT IS NEW AT KAISER PERMANENTE?



COVID-19 National Public Health Emergency Ends May 11, 2023

The federal government recently announced its plan to end the COVID-19 public health emergency.

For Clackamas County Members on the Traditional Medical plan*, Beginning May 12, 2023:

- COVID-19 vaccines will be covered under preventive benefits at \$0 copay
- **COVID-19 PCR testing** will be covered under the outpatient diagnostic lab benefit \$0 copay
- COVID-19 over-the-counter (OTC) antigen tests <u>will not be covered</u> consistent with current plan coverage that does not cover OTC tests
- **COVID-19 drug treatment** will be covered under the drug benefit with \$10 generic and \$20 brand copay
- Out-of-Network (OON) Services for COVID-19 will only be covered for emergency/urgent care situations









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

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Clackamas County General County Measurement Period: JUL-01-2021 through JUN-30-2022



- The total claims cost increased by 2.2%, while the KP average claims increased by 3.3%.
- Inpatient: PMPM cost increased by 29.2%.
 -Costs in medical, surgical and mental health increased while maternity, substance abuse and SNF decreased.
- Outpatient: PMPM cost decreased 4%.

-All costs in outpatient service categories, except Medical, Mental health, substance abuse, KP ER and Surgery professional services decreased. -Mental health cost and utilization continue to increase. -Substance abuse cost and utilization continue to increase.

-Emergency room KP increased.

- Pharmacy: PMPM cost remained almost stagnant at -0.1%. -Increase in all categories except for Brand/Non-Formulary and Generic/Non-Formulary. -Generic utilization is 93.4%
- Other: PMPM increased by 3.7%.

-Costs in ambulance, DME, dental and home health increased while hearing aids and vision hardware decreased.





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










Depression — effective continuation phase treatment


