Dear Congresswoman Chavez-DeRemer:

On behalf of the Clackamas County Board of County Commissioners, we are proud to support the request by the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde (CTGR) to pursue Congressionally Directed Spending to advance Phase II of the rehabilitation at Tumwata Village.

Clackamas County is supportive of the revitalization of the former Blue Heron Paper Mill site in downtown Oregon City and increased public access to one of Oregon's most hidden treasures – Willamette Falls. Since CTGR purchased the property in 2019, their development team has begun master planning and environmental restoration activities after over 100 years of industrial use.

If approved, the federal funding would allow CTGR to proceed with the design and construction of utilities and infrastructure on portions of the site nearest to downtown Oregon City. Their vision of rehabilitating the site, increasing public access and restoring jobs will require time and meaningful resources.
