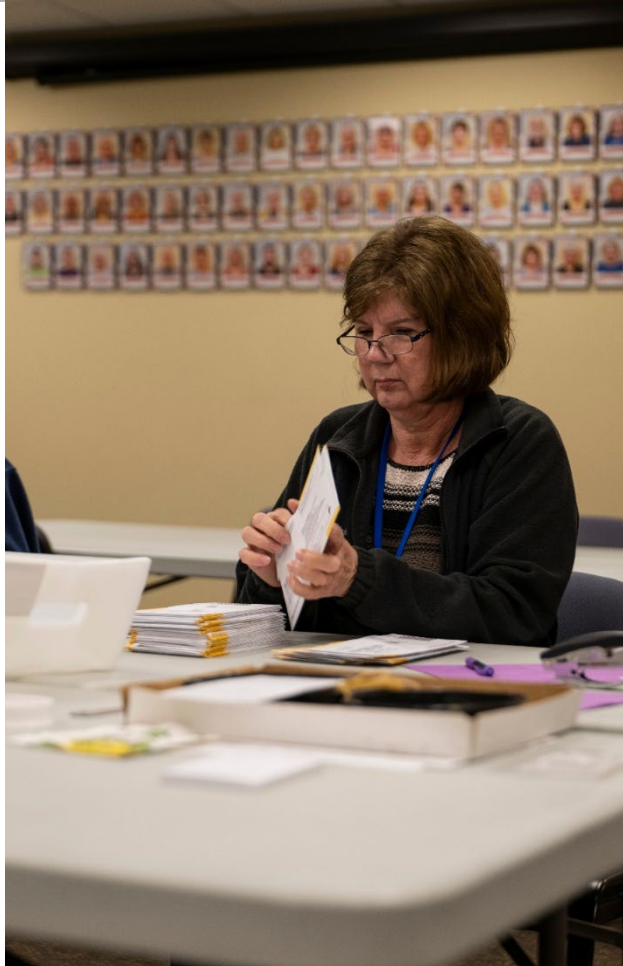


March 14 Special Election was a Success

- Conducted 4 Logic & Accuracy Tests verifying that our scanners are tabulating votes accurately.
- 19,953 Eligible Voters. 26.07% Turnout.
- 14 ballots (0.27%) challenged & could not be accepted because of signature issues.



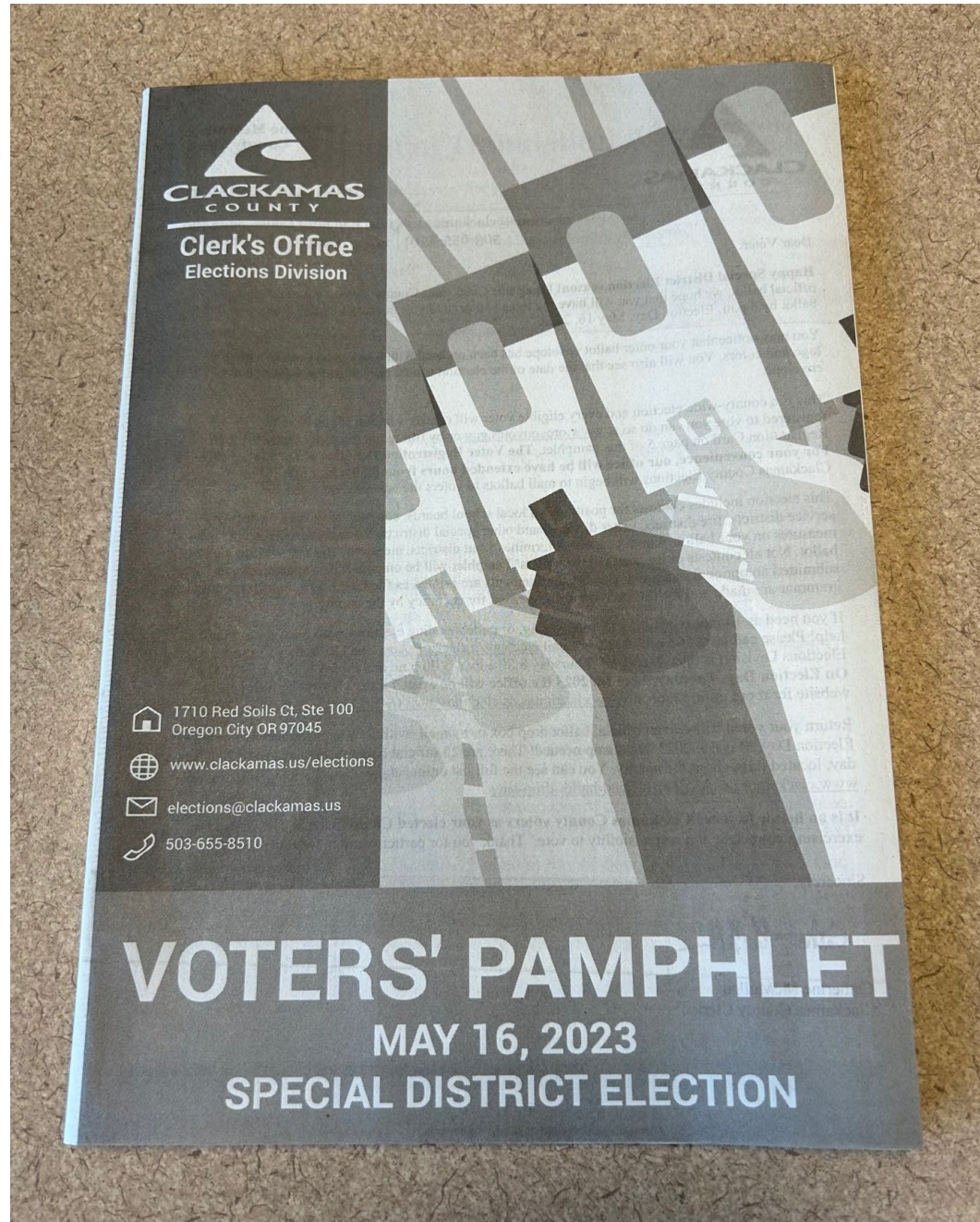
March 14 Special Election was a Success



- Unofficial results posted twice on Election Night & then five more times before official certification on April 6. Four days before statutory deadline.
- Election cost per eligible voter \$1.25.
- Election personnel cost per 1,000 ballots processed \$528.

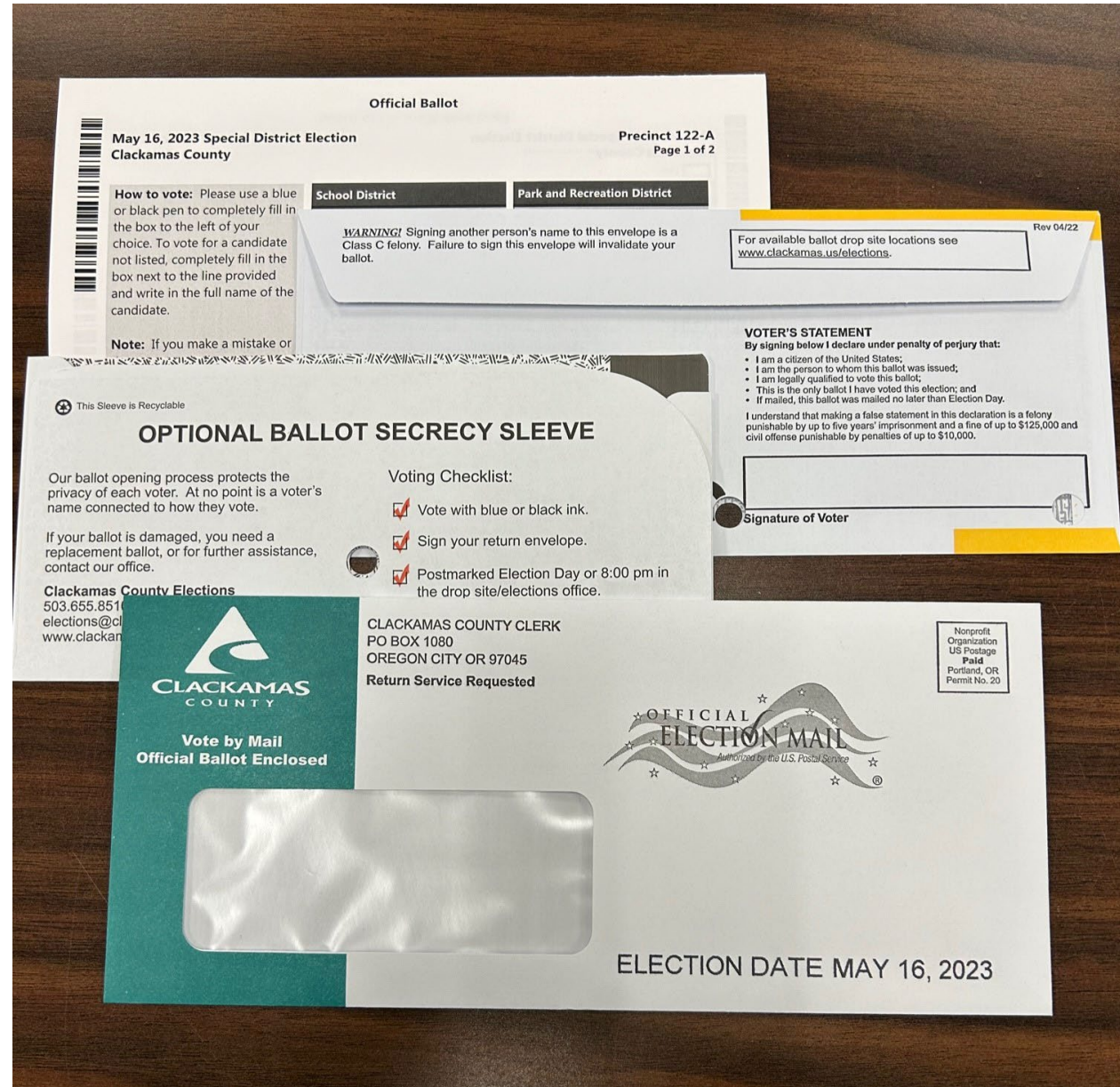
May 16 Special District Election

- April 19 – Voters' Pamphlets mailed to every residential household.
- April 25 – Voter Registration Deadline. Elections Division open 8:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.



May 16 Special District Election

- April 26 – Elections Division mails ballots to voters.
- May 4 – All voters should have received their ballot.



May 16 Special District Election

- **May 16 – Election Day.** Elections Division open 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. Ballots must be mailed with a valid postmark or returned to an official ballot drop site by 8:00 p.m. First report of unofficial results available at 8:00 p.m.
- **June 12 – Final election results certified.**
