**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**: NCPRD seeks to add three capital projects to the System Development Charges (SDC) Capital Improvements Plan ("CIP list") to make them eligible for use of SDC funding in the future. These projects include the Jennings Lodge Elementary School Neighborhood Park improvements, Concord Property Park and Community Center Improvements, and Hull and Swanson Natural Area. Under Oregon Revised Statute Section 223.309, the list may be modified at any time. Changes to the SDC CIP list that are part of the existing Ord. 11-2017 must be updated by adopting a new ordinance specifying these changes. Adoption requires a first reading and a second reading after 14 days or more.

The North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District (NCPRD) collects system development charges (SDCs) on new development within district boundaries so that future growth contributes a fair share to the cost of improvements and additions to parks and recreation facilities. Funds may only be used on projects identified on the SDC CIP list. This SDC CIP list is part of the *Parks and Recreation System Development Charges Update Methodology Report* adopted by Ordinance 09-2007. Since adoption in 2007, NCPRD has acquired properties, approved agreements, and conducted planning related to the three newer projects that can provide future improvements to support growth.

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The methodology and SDC CIP list have remained unchanged since 2007, although the 2007 Ordinance has been amended twice for other purposes (via Ord. 06-2014 & via Ord. 11-2017). NCPRD is proposing a new ordinance to amend the list by adding an "Appendix B" with information on the three added projects. The proposed ordinance and appendix is attached.

Placing these projects on the list makes them eligible for use of SDC funds; it does not obligate NCPRD to progress the projects, budget SDC funds, nor indicate full funding or development approvals. There are no changes to the methodology itself, therefore there are no changes to SDC rates and no changes to the eligible percentages of SDC funding that can be used toward total project costs (included in the appendix as "Growth Required Portion").

On February 8, 2023, the District Advisory Committee ("DAC") unanimously recommended that the three projects be added to the 2007 SDC list.

## Ordinance No. 03-2023

## An Ordinance Amending the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District's System Development Charge Ordinance

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Directors of North Clackamas Park and Recreation District ("NCPRD Board") adopted a system development charge ordinance in October, 1994, as subsequently amended (the "Ordinance"), authorized by ORS 223.297-223.314; and

**WHEREAS**, the NCPRD Board amended the Ordinance in 2007 (Ord. 09-2007), including the adoption of the 2007 Parks and Recreation System Development Charges Update Methodology Report, and while Ord. 06-2014 and Ord. 11-2017 further updated SDC policy, no changes were made in those updated ordinances to the Methodology Report; and

**WHEREAS,** the adopted Methodology Report contained the SDC Capital Improvement Plan listing all projects that could be eligible for System Development Charge ("SDC") funds; and

**WHEREAS**, multiple projects that are likely to move forward now to serve growth in the District either were not envisioned in 2007 or are on properties that NCPRD did not own or have agreements to develop on in 2007, therefore they are not currently on the SDC Capital Improvement Plan and cannot be eligible for SDC funds; and

**WHEREAS**, such projects that serve growth in the District will be eligible for use of SDC funds if added to the SDC Capital Improvement Plan;

Now, therefore, the NCPRD Board ordains as follows:

**Section 1:** Subsection 2(J) of the Ordinance is hereby amended to add the following:

The Board hereby adopts Appendix B to add three projects as described to the SDC Capital Improvement Plan contained within the Parks and Recreation System Development Charges Update Methodology Report.

- Section 2: The methodology report entitled "Parks and Recreation System Development Charges Update Methodology Report Methodology Report" is hereby amended by adding "Appendix B" as shown hereto in Exhibit A.
- **Section 3:** This ordinance shall be effective on the 90th day after adoption per ORS 203.045(9) unless it is adopted as an emergency or a later date is specified.
