WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Should staff bring an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) to a Business Meeting for Board approval to transfer the jurisdiction of a portion of Borland Road to the City of Tualatin?

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

County Staff have been negotiating with the City of Tualatin staff to transfer an approximately 3/4 mile long section of Borland Road that lies within the boundary of the City of Tualatin. This section of Borland Road is of an urban nature, with travel lanes, bike lanes, and sidewalks with non-compliant ADA Ramps. Transferring jurisdiction of this portion of Borland road would eliminate confusion to the public and improve the efficiencies of maintenance and public service. This proposed IGA would formalize an agreement to transfer jurisdiction in return for a payment of \$366,500, which is equal to the cost of a 2" asphalt overlay, in addition to rebuilding or installing nineteen (19) curb ramps to meet ADA requirements, and upgrades to an ADA signal at SW 56th Avenue. Payment of these funds would be contingent upon the City and County finalizing the jurisdictional transfer process. Once jurisdiction is transferred, the City becomes the "Road Authority" responsible for all maintenance, permitting and road standard activities.

- Bring an IGA to a Business Meeting for Board approval to transfer jurisdiction over a 3/4 mile long section of Borland Road to the city of Tualatin, which includes the payment of \$366,500 to the city that represents the cost of a 2" asphalt overlay and multiple ADA ramp and signal upgrades to meet current ADA requirements.
- 2) Do not proceed with the jurisdictional transfer. Maintain Clackamas County jurisdiction over the 3/4 mile long section of Borland Road. Clackamas County will be responsible for maintenance, permitting, ADA compliance and abatement of road hazards and other road activities.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is the recommendation of staff that the board direct staff to bring an IGA to a Business Meeting for Board approval to transfer jurisdiction over a 3/4 mile long section of Borland Road to the city of Tualatin, which includes the payment of \$366,500 to the city that represents the cost of a 2" asphalt overlay and multiple ADA ramp and signal upgrades to meet current ADA requirements..
