Local Public Safety Coordinating Council Meeting October 17th, 2023 12:00 – 12:30 pm Zoom Webinar

Dylan Blaylock, Public & Government Affairs, hosted the webinar and initiated the meeting. He introduced Malcolm McDonald, Clackamas County Community Corrections Director and LPSCC Chair, and stated the Chair will facilitate the meeting.

Dylan provided online meeting logistics and instructions about the submission process for public comments. ## Action Item – Discussion and Approval of the Clackamas County Community Corrections' Application for Measure 57 Supplemental Funding

After welcoming meeting participants, Chair McDonald discussed the implementation of Measure 57. He said this measure uses a statewide approach to implement statutory requirements that ensure funded programs are guided by evidence-based practices designed to reduce crime and substance misuse. He further explained implementation involves a balanced combination of treatment, supervision, and immediate sanctions.

Chair McDonald mentioned Measure 57 funding has been used to support the Clackamas Substance Abuse Program (CSAP) for several years and indicated the continued use of this funding to support the program. The request for funding approval is \$712,500 over a two-year period.

Chair McDonald explained the funding approval process involves initial approval at the local level, followed by a review by the Oregon Department of Corrections, Community Corrections Division. He then opened up the floor for any discussion before seeking a motion for approval.

The Chair called for a motion to approve the application for submission to the Department of Corrections. Rod Cook motioned to approve and District Attorney John Wentworth seconded the motion. With no "nay" votes from any members present, the vote was unanimous. No objections or further discussions were raised, and the motion was passed. Chair McDonald expressed gratitude to everyone for their participation and noted the tight timeline for submitting the application, acknowledging the effort of members in coming together for the meeting.
