Approval of Intergovernmental Agreement between the Housing Authority of Clackamas County and State of Oregon, Department of Human Services to provide funding for maintenance, repairs, remodeling, and renovation

The Housing Authority of Clackamas County (HACC), a Division of the Health, Housing and Human Services Department, requests approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the State of Oregon, Department of Human Services. This IGA would establish the basis for the State of Oregon to provide HACC funding for maintenance, repairs, remodeling, and renovation to seven homes owned by HACC. This IGA also provides a mechanism for adding additional units to the agreement over time.

The seven homes provide housing for persons with developmental disabilities under the State's Community Integration Project (CIP). The Housing Authority owns and provides the maintenance for the properties and leases the properties to the Clackamas County Health, Housing and Human Services department who sub-leases the properties to direct service providers.

Maximum not to exceed amount of \$200,000 payable to the Housing Authority of Clackamas County. Duration of Agreement: January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2015. This IGA has been approved by County Counsel. No County General Funds involved.

Recommendation

HACC recommends the Board approve the IGA between HACC and the State of Oregon and further recommend that Cindy Becker be authorized to sign on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners of the Housing Authority of Clackamas County.

The Social Services Division of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests the approval of Amendment #1 to the Interagency Agreement with the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District/Milwaukie Center to provide social services for Clackamas County residents age 60 and over. This agreement is for the Milwaukie Center to provide mandated Older American Act (OAA) funded services for persons in the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District.

This amendment is a budget adjustment. This amendment adjusts the match rate for Medicaid Waivered service client transportation services, redistributes the Older Americans Act (OAA) Title III-C funding for the senior nutrition program, and increases both the Nutrition Incentive Service Program (NISP) rate and Ride Connection transportation funding. This amendment also adds funding for Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) client intake services. Each year agency personnel assist low income elderly County residents to complete applications for LIEAP funds and receive \$6.50 reimbursement for an approved application.

This amendment increases the Agreement by \$43,345 for a new Agreement maximum of \$458,792. This Agreement is in the format approved by County Counsel as part of the H3S contract standardization project. No County General Fund dollars are involved. This amendment is retroactive back to the original start date of the contract, July 1, 2010; and continues through June 30, 2011.

Recommendation

Approval of Amendment #2 to an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Community Development Division and the Gladstone School District for building improvements to the Gladstone Center for Children and Families facility.

The Community Development Division of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests the approval of Amendment #2 to an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Gladstone School District for a building improvements project that will renovate 3,450 square feet of commercial space for the Family Stepping Stones Relief Nursery.

In order to offset the higher costs associated with the location of the Gladstone Health Care Clinic in space originally planned for the Relief Nursery, an additional amount of Community Development Block Grants funds have been added to the Relief Nursery construction budget. An additional \$100,000 of general CDBG funds is available for the Relief Nursery project bringing the total CDBG funding to \$460,000. \$75,000 of the additional CDBG funds will be for construction and \$25,000 will only be expended for unforeseen conditions that require a construction change order. The additional funding will reduce the burden on the school district's operating budget and allow adequate functional space for both clinic and nursery activities for low-income and vulnerable clients served at the child and family services facility.

APPROVAL OF A PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN CLACKAMAS COUNTY SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 1 (CCSD #1), AND JOHNSON CREEK WATERSHED COUNCIL (JCWC) FOR BUFFER ENHANCEMENT AND RESTORATION ACTIVITIES

The attached Partnership Agreement describes a partnership with funding to perform buffer enhancement and riparian activities within CCSD #1.

As part of the project to provide sanitary sewers for the North Clackamas Revitalization Area (NCRA), CCSD #1 has incurred mitigation requirements to meet the Habitat Conservation Area conditions of the Clackamas County Zoning and Development Ordinance. As the impact occurred at Mill Park along Johnson Creek, CCSD #1 has recognized an opportunity to partner with the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District and the Johnson Creek Watershed Council to meet the mitigation requirements while simultaneously enhancing Mill Park. CCSD #1, NCPRD and JCWC staff have met and created a planting plan to meet the requirements. Upon approval of this agreement, JCWC staff and community volunteers will begin the planting in Winter of 2010-11. The project will be maintained and monitored for five years to ensure success.

The term of agreement is July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2016. The cost of the work will be \$6,598.95 for 2010-2011 and a total of \$3,700.00 for monitoring and reporting over the five additional years following the planting in 2010-2011. The total cost of this project will be \$10,298.95. This project was a result of installing sanitary sewers and thus will be funded as part of the NCRA sewering project.

District Counsel has approved the Agreement as to form.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the Partnership Agreement between the CCSD #1 and JCWC for buffer enhancement and riparian restoration activities.
