



Felony Crime

The Clackamas County District Attorney’s Office issued and charged more than 1,750 adult felony cases during 2018.

- Property offenses included: burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and fraud/forgery.
- Violent offenses included homicide, rape or sexual assault, robbery and assault.
- Drug offenses included drug possession and drug trafficking.
- Conduct offenses included attempting to elude a police officer, failure to appear, escape, criminal mistreatment, and failure to report as a sex offender.



Misdemeanor Crime

More than 3,950 misdemeanor cases were reviewed and charged; 2,947 or 75% of the lead offenses included: driving under the influence of intoxicants, theft, driving while suspended or revoked, assault, harassment, criminal trespass, failure to perform duties of a driver when property damaged, unlawful possession of methamphetamine or heroin, and criminal mischief.

Case Management Docket

- This docket continued to increase the efficiency of the criminal justice system by ensuring prompt resolution of cases.
- An average of 29 percent of all criminal cases were settled with a guilty plea within five weeks after the first court appearance.
- Only 20 percent of all criminal cases were set for trial which resulted in a dramatic reduction in court appearances for victims, witnesses and law enforcement.

Family Support

During the past federal fiscal year, prosecutors and support enforcement agents collected \$23.1 million in current and past due child support. This revenue goes directly to children and families who may otherwise rely on county or state resources for financial support.

Victim Assistance

Advocates provided direct services to over 1,100 victims of domestic violence and assisted with more than 400 protective orders.

Juvenile Dependency

Prosecutors worked closely with the State Department of Human Services to protect children who come to the attention of authorities as a result of abuse or neglect. In 2018, they provided legal consultation, support, or courtroom advocacy on 245 juvenile dependency cases.
