Approval of Amendment #2 to a Grant with Northwest Housing Alternatives for HomeBase Program Operations and Client Financial Assistance in the amount of \$115,000 of General Funds Approved by County in Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Annual Budget

Purpose/Outcomes	Approval of amendment #2, which will allow Northwest Housing Alternatives (NHA) to continue to provide client financial assistance, program case management and administration to families and individuals who are homeless or at risk of being homeless.
Dollar Amount and Fiscal Impact	Amendment #2 increases the agreement by \$115,000 to a new total of \$347,316.42.

Duration	The amendment is effective upon signature with an eligible grant expenditure period of July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022

BACKGROUND:

The Social Services Division of the Health, Housing and Human Services Department requests approval of a Grant Amendment with Northwest Housing Alternatives, Inc. (NHA) for HomeBase client financial assistance, program case management and administration. NHA provides financial assistance to families and individuals who are homeless or at risk

of being homeless. NHA also provides financial assistance to low-income families and individuals to access affordable housing or remain stably housed.

Beginning in the fiscal year 2012-2013, the Board of Commissioners awarded a direct grant to NHA of \$100,000 per year to support NHA's HomeBase program. In addition, County granted NHA an additional \$15,000 of special client funds for the HomeBase program. County has approved extending the funding as part of the County's approved annual budget for fiscal year 2021-2022.

The Amendment was approved by County Counsel and is effective upon signature by all parties with an eligible grant expenditure period of July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022. Amendment #2 adds funding and extends the Agreement by one year. Maximum compensation is increased by \$115,000 County General Funds for a maximum agreement value of \$347,316.42.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board approval of this Grant Amendment, and authorization for Tootie Smith, Board Chair, to sign.

Justification for Amend	ment:			
This Amendment #2 is entered into between Northwest Housing Alternatives, Inc. ("Agency" or "Contractor") and Clackamas County ("County") and shall become part of that certain grant agreement ("Agreement") entered into between both parties on November 7, 2019. Beginning in the 2012/13 fiscal year, the Board of Commissioners awarded a direct grant to Agency in an				
amount of \$100,000 per year to support Agency's HomeBase program. In addition, County granted Agency an additional \$15,000 of special client funds for the Homebase program. County has approved extending the funding provided as part of the County's approved annual budget for FY 21-22.				
Amendment #2 will allow Agency to continue to provide client financial assistance, program case management and administration to families and individuals who are homeless or at risk of being homeless to access affordable housing or remain stably housed.				
Amendment #2 adds funding and extends the Agreement by one year, with an eligible grant expenditure period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. Maximum compensation is increased by \$115,000 for a maximum agreement value of \$347,316.42.

AMEND: ARTICLE I, SECTION 1, Effective Date and Duration:

 - a. Original Term: July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020
 - b. Amendment #1 Term: July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021

AMEND: ARTICLE I, SECTION 3, Consideration:

3. Consideration. The County agrees to pay Contractor, from available and authorized funds, a sum not to exceed Two Hundred Thirty-two Thousand, Three Hundred Sixteen dollars and Forty-Two Cents (\$232,316.42), for accomplishing the Work required by this Contract. Payments made are on a cost-reimbursement basis for eligible expenditures in accordance with Exhibit A. If any interim payments to Contractor are made, such payments shall be made only in accordance with the schedule and requirements in Exhibit A.

TO READ:

3. Consideration. The County agrees to pay Contractor, from available and authorized funds, a sum not to exceed *Three Hundred Forty-seven Thousand, Three Hundred Sixteen Dollars and Forty-Two Cents (\$347,316.42)*, for accomplishing the Work. AMEND: EXHIBIT A, ARTICLE III, COMPENSATION, SECTION B, TO INCLUDE:

County will communicate HMIS report requirements to Contractor, and Contractor shall include such required HMIS report with its monthly invoice submittals for services from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022.
