Dear Republican and Democratic Parties of Clackamas County,

It has come to my attention that there have been a few questions about Precinctcommittee Person (PCP) candidate filings.

All filed PCP candidates were placed on the ballot for the precinct in which they filed. Some candidates did not file in the precinct in which they live but in an adjoining precinct. This is permitted and the candidate is qualified for that office. There are no errors on the PCP ballots.

Key items to note:

- Candidates can file in their resident precinct, or adjacent precinct, or any precinct in their State Representative district, within the same county.
- Write-in votes will only be tallied if declaration or nomination forms have been filed by the deadline.
- A minimum of 3 votes is required to be elected.

This is all according to ORS 249.046.
