Oregon White Oak

This Oregon White Oak is located within the Oak Grove unincorporated area of Clackamas County.

The tree species is slow growing and at maturity can reach up to 90 feet with an average lifespan of 95 to 135 years.

The exact age of this tree is unknown, but is believed to exceed the average lifespan. It is speculated that the tree was planted as a sapling when Susan Creighton came to the area and established the Oak Grove town site.

In 1908 the Methodist Episcopal Church was established as part of the first Oak Grove subdivision, Creighton Plat, plated and recorded in 1892. It is here where the tree stands and is known as one of the "Triangle Oaks" located in the neighborhood.

This tree is nominated and approved under the Heritage Tree category of specimen.
