Rotations:

 The Sheep show is held during the second rotation during the fair. Sheep Exhibitors will be allowed in the barn August 14, 2019 ONLY after all equipment is removed and cleaning is complete from 1st rotation. No tack or setup is allowed before this time, (per Overall Livestock Superintendent). All entries must be in the barn by **9:45 AM** Thursday August 15, 2019. Release times for livestock entries will be on Sunday, August 18, 2019. Times will be announced and coordinated by the Overall Livestock Superintendent.

Specific Rules:

- 1. Exhibitors should read General Rules and Regulations and Livestock Department Rules found on Clackamas County Fair website under Exhibitor Handbook.
- 2. Bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor.
- 3. No animals allowed in the barn until passing health check with the Superintendent.
- 4. Tack space is limited for all Open Livestock. Maximum space for sheep will be 4 pens.
- Only one days feeding is allowed in the barn. Exhibitors will be provided a drive in pass to use each morning to haul in more feed. All vehicles have to be off the grounds by 9:45 AM each morning.
- 6. All animals entered in the show <u>must be registered and Fed tags must be in ears of all</u> <u>Ewes and Rams of all ages.</u> Breed association ear tags must be in place upon arrival at Fairgrounds (exception of Divisions 174, 175, & 176 Natural Colored).
- 7. Each animal's registration papers must be checked Thursday, August 15, 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM in order to show.
- 8. Pens will be assigned. Mark number of pens required on entry form.
- 9. <u>ELY BARN</u>: Decoration rule- top of curtains/banners needs to be 8' off the ground and a maximum of 24" long. No obstruction between bottom of curtain and ground level. No lattice allowed as curtains or back drops. <u>The only lattice allowed is one 4' wide by 6' tall sheet per club on the north or south end of the pen row</u>. <u>Changes may be necessary during fair due to air flow and air quality for animal & human health</u>.

- 10. DIVISIONS 174 & 175, NATURAL COLORED SHEEP ONLY: Judging will be based 60% on wool and 40% on confirmation. Wool Judged on color, uniformity of fiber in fleece, absence of cotting, and cleanliness.
- 11. Shropshire sheep shown slick shorn. Slick shorn is defined as being shorn completely to the hide within five days of the show date. The wool may be left from the rear hocks down and the front knees down plus the wool cap defined as from the ears and poll forward.
- 12. The Clackamas County Fair will offer a "GO FOR THE GOLD" Supreme Flock Award to the best flock bred and owned by an exhibitor. Winner will be chosen from Class 10.
 - a. All young flocks must compete.
 - b. Judging will be held at the conclusion of the show.
 - c. A Perpetual Trophy will be engraved with the winner's name and presented to the winner for him or her to keep for one year.
 - d. Winner of "GO FOR THE GOLD" will not be eligible to compete for the Clackamas County Young Flock award.
