The Clackamas County Department of Transportation and Development – Traffic Safety Program includes a Motor Carrier Safety team responsible for permitting commercial vehicles and inspecting vehicle in compliance with Oregon and USDOT regulations. All inspections are routed through the ODOT Commerce and Compliance Division. This agreement amendment

updates the procedures to include use of the ODOT ASPEN commercial vehicle inspection software and requirements to protect personal private information (PPI) to be in alignment with current practice.

AMENDMENT NUMBER 01 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT Commercial Vehicle, Driver and Cargo Inspection

This is Amendment No. 01 to the Agreement between the **State of Oregon**, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as "ODOT," and **Clackamas County**, acting by and through its Motor Carrier Enforcement Division, hereinafter referred to as "CCMC," entered into on January 23rd, 2015.

It has now been determined by ODOT and CCMC that the Agreement referenced above shall be amended to update language to define information submittal requirements.

1. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Amendment shall become effective on the date it is fully executed and approved as required by applicable law.

2. Amendment to Agreement.

- a. CCMC Obligations, Paragraph 6, Page 3, which reads:
- 6. When performing inspections as described herein, said inspections shall be documented on forms provided by ODOT. Whenever possible, inspections shall be conducted electronically using ASPEN™ software provided by ODOT.

Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

- 6. When performing inspections as described herein, said inspections shall be documented electronically using the system(s) provided by ODOT or on paper forms provided by ODOT. All appropriate measures to protect personal protected information (PPI), shall be taken by CCMC prior to submittal. PPI is defined as information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity or, when combined with other personal or identifying information, is linked or linkable to a specific individual.
- **3.** <u>Counterparts</u>. This Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts (by facsimile or otherwise) each of which is an original and all of which when taken together are deemed one agreement binding on all Parties, notwithstanding that all Parties are not signatories to the same counterpart.
- 4. <u>Original Agreement</u>. Except as expressly amended above, all other terms and conditions of the original Agreement are still in full force and effect. Agency certifies that the representations, warranties and certifications in the original Agreement are true and correct as of the effective date of this Amendment and with the same effect as though made at the time of this Amendment.

THE PARTIES, by execution of this Agreement, hereby acknowledge that their signing representatives have read this Agreement, understand it, and agree to be bound by its terms and conditions.
