Description

Clackamas County Public Health and PHAC members will support and be involved in the County's COVID-19 Recovery and Resilience response. CCPHD will encourage diverse representation from the community, health equity zones, EOC Liaisons, BIPOC and other priority populations. These county created committees will assist with the development and establishment of Public Health community COVID-19 priorities.

The Public Health Advisory Committee (PHAC) will be asked to take the lead on Public Health's response to addressing systemic racism internally and externally. Representatives from the three priority sections may be asked to join the work on this topic.

Racial equity: Measures and guidelines become integrated into the Health Equity guiding principle.

- The Blueprint Plan Update document is currently being edited and prepared for placement on BlueprintClackamas.com & Public Health webpage.
- <u>BlueprintClackamas.com</u> will serve as our grant-making Hub.
 - Current Federal, State, County and limited zip code data is available.
 - Communication, Q & A, and technical assistance log between County and applicants will be managed through this webpage.
 - ▶ Bidder's Conference video will be found on this site.
 - Examples of successful and previous grant awards will be available on the website.

- Grant making software selected to support streamlined and more efficient grant making process.
 - Contract expected to be completed with SurveyMonkey Applications by mid October at the earliest.

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- > Paper process to be used for Large/Impact Grant that is released in October
- > On-line, virtual process for grants thereafter.

Community Engagement & Accessibility

- Build on extensive community engagement process that occurred during Phase II and the development of the objectives and strategies.
- CCPHD staff is developing a Division and H3S –wide community engagement process to promote the grant.
 - ▶ Need support and involvement from PHAC members to promote the grant.
 - > Targeted outreach with high priority population serving organizations: BIPOC, rural, disabled, elderly, food, poverty,
 - ► Transparency
 - Capacity building
 - Relationship building & strengthening partnerships

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Blueprint Grant-Making Update

Improved Blueprint grant accessibility – draft considerations

- Simplicity; paper and virtual platform easy to use; check-boxes, prefilled responses
- ADA accessibility; vision aids
- Multiple languages of the RFP
- Paper and video grant application submissions

Blueprint Grants: Who can apply?

- ▶ For- profit, non-profit and not-for-profit organizations serving Clackamas County.
- Coalitions
- Faith-based entities
- Small businesses
- Schools
- Individuals and County Departments are NOT eligible to apply.

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Blueprint Grant-Making Update

Blueprint Grant Types: (Proposed options)

Released Mid-October; (Paper process)

Innovation Grant: \$10k-\$50k – For up to 16 months or June 30, 2023. Allows organizations to pilot creative ideas or new methods to implement solutions to an identified community need.

Optional:

Impact grant: \$50k-\$75k – For up to 16 months or June 30, 2023. Allows organizations or coalitions to implement larger scale projects that address communities' needs by accomplishing the goals and objectives outlined in the Blueprint.

Blueprint Grant Types: (Proposed)

Capacity & Community Building Grant: Funding Levels TBD

- Collaborative funding
- Focus on regional CBOs building organizational sustainability and health, developing partnerships and relationships within Clackamas County high priority targeted populations
- The applicant will address and improve health equity and health disparities in Clackamas County.
- CBO / organizations / applicants build community relationships/partnerships with other Clackamas County serving agencies and organizations for the implementation of specific strategies.

Next Steps:

Phase III: Grant-making Prep

- Blueprint Plan document update by June 30
- Grant-making software integration into bidding process

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• Strategy & funding categorization

Phase IV: Grant Release

- Early fall for Large grant release
- January 2022 June 2023 for "Rolling" grant release
- PHAC members serve as reviewers for Large and Capacity Building grants

Phase V: Plan Implementation

- Fall 2021 June 2023
- Committee work; strategy implementation
- Funding efforts monitored
