Keller Property

Bigleaf Maple Tree

This Bigleaf Maple is on property with a single-family house built in 2001 and a house constructed in the 1800's that is no longer habitable.

The tree was planted next to the original dwelling. The sapling reportedly was transported in a covered wagon from Nbraska by pioneers in the 1800s. It is a dominate landmark, visible from Redland Road.

The massive branches extend approximately 20 feet from the trunk, forming a 43-foot canopy.

The central trunk has some damage, but the overall health of the tree is good.

This tree qualifies as a specimen, historic and landmark heritage tree.
