Clackamas County Public Health <u>Commercial Tobacco Prevention Grants</u>

What is this?

Clackamas County Public Health Division is partnering with Washington County Public Health Department to provide funding for Community Based Organizations to lead community-driven and equity-centered work in the area of commercial tobacco prevention.

Who can apply?

501c(3) organizations, or organizations in partnership with a 501c(3)

How much funding is available?

\$250,000 is available for CBOs serving Clackamas and/or Washington County, with the goal of funding between \$20,000 - \$25,000 for up to 12 organizations.

How can the funding be used?

Priority goes to organizations representing culturally diverse communities to address tobacco-related health disparities and/or address root causes of commercial tobacco use. Projects could include but are not limited to:

- Commercial Tobacco Health Education and Prevention Activities
- Data Collection / Identifying and Assessing Community Priorities related to commercial tobacco
- Policy Development and Advocacy for commercial tobacco
- Culturally Specific Tobacco Cessation

Timeline

The Notice of Funding Opportunity and Application will be announced on Oct. 14, 2022, posted on www.clackamas.us/grants. Applications will be due on Nov. 10, 2022 at 5 p.m., with applicants being notified by Dec. 15, 2022. Funds need to be spent by June 30, 2023.
