The best way to help fight distracted driving is to get educated. Reading this comic is a great place to start!

Distraction occurs any time you take your eyes off the road, your hands off the wheel, and your mind off your primary task: driving safely. Any non-driving activity you engage in is a potential distraction and increases your risk of crashing.

Texting is the most alarming distraction, because it involves manual, visual, and cognitive distraction simultaneously. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of an entire football field, blindfolded. It's extraordinarily dangerous.

Some people still don't know how dangerous distracted driving is! Others know about the risks of texting and talking while driving, but still choose to do

so anyway. They make the mistake of thinking the statistics don't apply to them, that they can defy the odds. But eventually their luck will run out.

Our youngest and most inexperienced drivers are most at risk, with 16% of all distracted driving crashes involving drivers under 20. But they are not alone. At any given moment during daylight hours, over 660,000 vehicles are being driven by someone using a handheld cell phone.

Distracted driving kills. The friends, family, and neighbors of the thousands of people killed each year in distracted driving crashes will tell you it is a very serious safety problem. Nearly half a million people are injured each year.
