## Vaccination opportunities

The COVID-19 vaccines are widely available across Oregon and most do not require an appointment.

The vaccine is available for **free**. You do *not* need health insurance and you do *not* need a social security number. ID is *not* required.

## Important information about the COVID-19 vaccines

- The vaccines cannot give you COVID-19 and will not harm you or your baby
- None of the vaccines contain a live virus and they cannot change your DNA or your baby's DNA
- The available vaccines have been closely studied to determine their safety in people of different ages, races, and ethnicities – including pregnant people!
- Vaccination of pregnant people builds antibodies that may protect their baby
- Side effects are common and may include a sore arm, headache, or tiredness – these should go away in 1-2 days
- COVID-19 vaccination is strongly recommended for all people 12 years and older, including people who are pregnant, breastfeeding, trying to get pregnant now, or might become pregnant in the future
- Pregnant people and those who have recently given birth are more likely to get severely ill with COVID-19 compared with non-pregnant people
