| Director Update - <i>Mary</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ CCO 2.0 - OHA is intending on awarding 2 CCO's contracts for Clackamas County. Each CCO will have to do a readiness assessment. Official contracts will be done in September for a 1/1/20 effective date. ➤ CMHP - CMHP contract term went from 24 months to 18 months to make it align with the calendar FY. No increase in revenue dollars. Aid & Assist decreased funding by 18.5 million dollars for the state. County will be getting 6 months of funding for outpatient services. The state recognizes that there is a discrepancy and has until December to come up with a better plan for funding based on data. | |
