APPROVAL OF LAST MEETING MINUTES

CITIZEN CONCERNS:

Laurie raised a concern about traffic related to the Chic-fil-A restaurant on Sunnyside. This will be discussed later on in the meeting after our special guest.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Lt. Richard Sheldon of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office presented on what the CCSO is seeing on the roads and trends on citations. See attached presentation. Lt. Sheldon shared that while traffic is down, they are not seeing a reduction in citations. They are showing increased speeding and reckless driving. The committee expressed their gratitude to Lt. Sheldon for his presentation and hoped for more at a later time.

Back to CITIZEN CONCERNS:

The concern was both eastbound and westbound turning from Sunnyside onto 93rd. Christian will look into this and report back to the TSC.

OTHER DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- a. **Monthly/YTD fatal crash update:** Christian shared the most recent fatal report summary for 2020. Rates are fairly consistent over the past few years with coming in at 34 fatalities for 2020.
- b. **Radar speed sign:** Christian shared pictures of the sign and shared that the committee will need to discuss the next site soon.

ADDITIONAL AGENDA ITEMS:

- Mike asked for a breakdown of pedestrian crashes on McLaughlin to review.
- Rob shared that the County is launching a revision of its Bicycle and Pedestrian plan.
- Christian shared a new project starting soon that will install enhanced curve warning signs on 110 miles of county roads.
