

Second Housing Affordability Panel Discussion

In the 2017 Performance Clackamas Update, the Board set the following goal:

By 2022, 2000 units of housing, affordable to a variety of residents, will be developed within Clackamas County, through a combination of public and private partnerships, and appropriate regulatory changes. Of that number, the Housing Authority goal will be to provide 1000 units affordable to households earning 60% of the area median income or less.

In order to better understand the policy options and their implications the County is having a series of four panel discussions on housing affordability for elected officials and staff from the county and our city partners.

Our panelists will be:

- Emily Lieb, Metro Equitable Housing Initiative.
- Anna Geller of Geller Silvis, a developer of affordable housing.
- Martha McLennan of Northwest Housing Alternatives.
- Homer Williams, Real Estate Development

Ms. Lieb will focus on the spectrum of affordability, and will provide an update on Metro's equitable housing strategy.

Ms. Geller and Ms. McLennan will focus on the provision of affordable housing by the private and not-for-profit sectors.

Mr. Williams will focus on real estate development
