North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District Board of Directors

Approval of a Board Order authorizing the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District to apply for a Local Government Grant from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department for the play area at the community park at the Concord Property. Grant value is \$500,000 with a \$500,000 match. Funding through State grant with match funded by NCPRD Capital Asset Fund. No County General Funds are involved.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District (NCPRD) is currently designing a new park and playground on the 5.94-acre NCPRD-owned Concord Property, which sits prominently at the juncture between the highly commercial area fronting SE McLoughlin Boulevard and a residential neighborhood. It is located in the heart of the Oak Grove community and adjacent to the Jennings Lodge community in unincorporated Clackamas County between the cities of Gladstone and Milwaukie. The Concord Property Playground (Project) within the Community Park will be situated alongside the community center and the new Oak Lodge Library, and will provide opportunities for inclusive recreation and connections to nature.

In March 2018, NCPRD took ownership of Concord Elementary School in Oak Grove as part of a Strategic Partnership with North Clackamas School District. The Concord School was acquired to revitalize the vacant building and surrounding open space for public use, and to bring new amenities and recreational opportunities to residents in Oak Lodge and throughout the District.

With input from over 1,300 community members, and in coordination with Clackamas County and consultants, the Master Plan was developed in 2019-2020 for the Concord Property and its future use. The NCPRD Advisory Committee and Board of County Commissioners adopted the Master Plan in January 2021.

The expressed community goals for this site include the creation of a park with natural features and play area, flexible open space for recreation and events, and a plaza to serve the neighborhood and broader community.

NCPRD is moving forward with design and engineering for the development of a new park on the Concord Property. Park features include a nature-based playscape, a multi-use playfield, picnic areas, restroom, walking paths, benches, and plaza for performances and programming.

Due to funding constraints, the play area has been divided into two phases. NCPRD plans to fund Phase I of the inclusive nature-based play area with NCPRD funds and Metro local share funds. NCPRD is seeking Local Government grant funds to fund Phase II of the inclusive nature-based play area. This provides an opportunity to fully construct the play area and further leverage NCPRD funds. NCPRD will provide \$500,000 in local matching funds to fulfill its 50% share of obligation related to this grant application should the grant funds be awarded. These will be from NCPRD Capital Projects funds that are planned for Phase I.

A Board Order is required by the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, the grant administrator, to apply for grant funding assistance.

The library and community center is on track to begin construction in Fall 2023 with the site improvements and Phase I playground beginning in Spring 2024.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board, acting as the NCPRD Board of Directors, approve this Board Order authorizing the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District to apply for an Oregon Parks and Recreation Department Local Government Grant for development of the playground at the Concord Property Community Park.

Whereas, North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District ("NCPRD") desires to participate in this grant program to the greatest extent possible as a means of providing needed park and recreation improvements and enhancements; and

Whereas, the NCPRD Advisory Committee ("DAC") and the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners, acting as the Board of Directors of NCPRD, have identified improvements at the Concord Property as a high priority need within the Oak Grove community and adjacent to the Jennings Lodge community in unincorporated Clackamas County between the cities of Milwaukie and Gladstone; and

Whereas, the Concord Property project exercised an extensive and robust community engagement process during master planning in 2019 through 2020 that helped shape the design for the park and playground; and

Whereas, NCPRD is moving forward with design and engineering for the development of a new park that includes features such as a nature-based play area, a multi-use playfield, picnic areas, walking paths, benches, restroom, and plaza for performances and programming; and

Whereas, NCPRD is seeking Local Government Grant funding specifically for completion of Phase II of the inclusive nature-based play area within the larger community park; and

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Whereas, on March 8, 2023 the DAC approved a letter of support and recommended that the NCPRD Board of Directors support the grant application; and

Whereas, the Concord Playground project is consistent with the goals of the grant program and meets necessary funding match for the program; and

Whereas, NCPRD has available local matching funds to fulfill its 50% share of obligation related to this grant application should the grant funds be awarded; and

Whereas, NCPRD will provide adequate funding for ongoing operations and maintenance of this facility should the grant funds be awarded.

NOW THEREFORE, the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners do hereby order that the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners, acting as the Board of Directors of NCPRD, demonstrates its support for the submittal of a grant application to the Oregon Park and Recreation Department for development of the playground at the community park at the Concord Property and does hereby authorize NCPRD to apply for approximately \$500,000 for play area improvements.
