New Park Place Community Reimagined Public Housing Residents Prepare for Change and New Opportunities

After many years of planning and preparation, the redevelopment of public housing neighborhoods in Clackamas County is moving forward.

The new, beautiful and modern housing being built in these neighborhoods will play an important role in responding to the housing crisis in our region and the need for more housing that is affordable in Clackamas County.

Park Place Redevelopment Engagement Series #1

This spring, residents of the Clackamas Heights and OCVM neighborhoods have taken part in a planning process to design what will be called the new Park Place community. This Redevelopment engagement series concluded with a Community Open House held on June 5th at the Park Place Church. At this event, the design team discussed the project's history, outlined next steps in the design process, and unveiled the preferred site plan. Attendees engaged with the design team, asked questions, provided feedback, and participated in games, a raffle, and a walking tour of the redevelopment site.

Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to participate in the surveys and meetings. The feedback we've received has been integral to guiding the site design. The Housing Authority would like to especially express our gratitude to the Community Advisory Committee for their time and willingness to share their experiences. Their contributions played a significant role in shaping the concept plan and provided valuable insight and ideas to the design team.

Next Steps

The Housing Authority and the design team will begin the land use and entitlement process with the City of

Oregon City and other stakeholders to continue refining the design. The Housing Authority will also be procuring an architect and general contractor to help design the buildings and further consolidate the redevelopment plan.

There will be additional opportunities for residents to provide feedback in the coming months on topics including: unit design and amenities, community space, landscaping and site amenities.

The Housing Authority will be notifying residents of these additional engagement opportunities as the design process progresses.

Public Housing Repositioning Update

The Housing Authority continues to make progress transitioning units from the public housing program. In late May, HACC submitted a Section 18 Disposition application to HUD for its Scattered Site public housing portfolio. Once HUD approves the application, HACC will begin to schedule meetings with residents to discuss individual needs and next steps.

HACC submitted Section 18 applications for Hillside Park Phase 2, Clackamas Heights, and Oregon City View Manor at end of June. HACC anticipates receiving approval from HUD later this year. Please see the updated resident relocation & redevelopment timeline below to understand when your household can expect to starting working with Relocation

counselors to find housing with a Section 8 voucher.

If you are currently living in a public housing unit and you are interested in relocating with a Section 8 tenant-protection voucher as soon as they are available, please let Darcy or Gloria (contact info listed below) know so they can prioritize your relocation.

HACC and its relocation team are committed to keeping residents informed about the process and answering questions about relocation and the repositioning process. Please contact us at any time.

Opportunities for Home Ownership

With the sale of Scattered Site units, the Development team is working to provide homeownership opportunities for residents who might be mortgage ready to purchase available homes either at market rate or as part of a community land trust.

IDA Matched Savings Accounts for Home Ownership



What is an Homeownership IDA ?

A Home Ownership Individual Development Account (IDA) is a matched savings account you can use on a down payment on a home.

Every \$1 you save in your IDA account is matched with \$5 more.

How can I use the money?

You can use the savings in your Homeownership IDA for down payment, inspection and closing costs when you buy your first home.

What is the Homeownership IDA Lottery?

Because the funding for the IDA program is limited this year, all eligible households who submit an interest application will be entered into a lottery to be held on *Thursday, August 8th.*



You save \$2000 + \$10,000 matching funds = \$12,000 Savings for a down payment on a home

Am I eligible to enter the lottery for a Homeownership IDA?

You are eligible to enter the lottery if you:

- $\sqrt{}$ Are a Public Housing household undergoing the relocation process.
- $\sqrt{10}$ Have a minimum household income of \$40,000.
- $\sqrt{}$ Do not currently have an IDA matched savings account.
- √ Have completed or are registered to complete the *Financial Foundations* workshop offered online through DevNW.
- ✓ Submit an application to be entered into the Homeownership IDA lottery by August 7th.

How do I find out more?

The Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Program *is accepting applications!*

By enrolling in the FSS program, you will have the opportunity to save with an *escrow account* and get support to meet your personal and career goals.

Residents have used the savings in their escrow accounts to purchase homes, buy cars, pay for education, get out of debt and get ahead in life.

A Relocation Road Map: Finding Your New Home with Your Voucher

The following is a road map to help you know what to expect when you use your relocation voucher to find your new home. Please look at the table on page 2 for a reminder of when your household can expect to start the relocation process and reach out to staff listed in this newsletter to get any questions you have answered.



Meet with Your Relocation Counselor.

The interview with the Relocation counselor is to find out what your priorities are for your housing search.

They will also want to know if you need extra support with things like transportation or internet access to look for housing with your voucher.

At this appointment, your household will also receive an *estimate* of the amount of rent your voucher will cover based on your income and household size.

Attend Your Voucher Orientation.

At the Orientation (scheduled after your Intake and Eligibility Packet is processed) you will learn how to use your voucher to find housing.

At the orientation, you will receive:

- Your *Voucher*
- Your Rent Calculation Worksheet which will help you know if the housing you are looking at is within the range that you can afford with your voucher.
- A blank *RTA* (Request for Tenancy Approval) that you will give to the landlord you want to rent from.

Search for Housing with Your Voucher.

You will have 120 days to find housing with your voucher.



Find A Place Where You Want to Apply.

You will complete an application for the property and turn it in.

Relocation pays your application fee.

The Landlord screens your application, and if approved, sends your RTA to HACC.



Pause While Your Unit Passes Inspection.

HACC schedules an inspection of the housing unit you applied for.



You will receive an intake and eligibility packet to complete and turn into HACC.

For *each member* of the household, you will need:

- IDs
- Birth certificates
- Social security cards
- Information about your assets
- Income verification (Benefits statements or 2 months of most recent pay stubs)

Sign Your New Lease. Get Your Keys.

Complete your leasing paperwork with your new landlord and get your keys. When your new housing passes inspection, your new landlord will schedule a leasing appointment and a move in date with you.

Relocation will pay your security deposit and schedule movers and a moving truck.



Resources for Getting Ready For a Successful Housing Search



When the time comes (see Redevelopment timeline on page 2), Relocation housing counselors will be supporting you in your search for a new home with your voucher. If you can start addressing any potential bar-

riers to renting now – in the long run, you will have more housing options to choose from.

Things that can make your housing search easier and less stressful include:

- Understanding how your voucher works and how to search for rental housing with it. See the Road Map on the opposite page!
- Staying in touch with the Relocation team so that they can send you leads, pay your application fees, security deposits and moving costs.
- Having a credit score above 660
- Exploring expungement of any criminal record
- Resolving rental debt owed to a landlord
- Having ID, birth certificates as well as benefits and income documentation for each member of the household.

Rent Well

To feel more confident and set yourself up for success in your future housing search, we highly encourage tenants going through relocation to take this course!

Whether you are interested in knowing your rights as a tenant, finding out how landlords might screen you, or want to boost your home hunting skills, Rent Well is for you.

Community Lending Works Credit Building Loans

A Credit Builder Loan is a small loan designed to help you establish or boost your credit profile.

It is simple and works like this: You make small monthly payments over a year to CLW. CWL reports your payments to the major credit bureaus. After 12 months of payments, your good payment history increases your credit score and we return the principal to you.

Property Management Concerns

Lawn Maintenance Charges Increasing

If you are a scattered site resident, please keep up with your lawn mowing and maintenance as beginning July 1st, mowing charges are increasing.

If you receive a notice and don't respond promptly, you will charged at a rate of \$50/hour for the first two hours and then \$23/hour for the total time it



takes Maintenance staff to mow and maintain your lawn.

Reach out to your Property Manager if you have concerns about this.

Did you notice you received a notice?

Maintenance issued 24-notices for pre-inspections all during the first three weeks of July to prepare for HUD REAC inspections at Clackamas Heights on July 22nd, OCVM on July 23rd and Hillside Park on July 26th.

HACC funding is tied to whether we pass REAC inspections in units randomly selected in each neighborhood. Please address any issues found during your pre-inspection, such as a blocked entry, items too close to your heaters or other safety issues as quickly as possible.
