Approval of Amendment #01 to a Contract with Project Quest dba Quest Center for Integrative Health for W.I.S.H Program Services. Amendment adds \$45,000.00 to the Contract, increasing the maximum grant value to \$135,000.00.
Contract funded with Behavioral Health Division Fund Balance.

Purpose/Outcomes	Contractor provides the Wellness, Integrity, and Sustainable Health Pain Management Program or W.I.S.H. Program. The program is an integrated medical and behavioral health program designed to treat chronic pain through the use of non-opioid interventions.

BACKGROUND:

The Behavioral Health Division of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests the approval of Amendment #01 to a Contact with Project Quest dba Quest Center for Integrative Health for Wellness, Integrity, and Sustainable Health Pain Management Program or W.I.S.H. Program services to eligible Clackamas County clients. The W.I.S.H. Program is an integrated medical and behavioral health program designed to treat chronic pain through the use of non-opioid interventions. The program integrates acupuncture, yoga, mental health, medication management, treatment for substance use disorder, nutrition and peer support in a community setting.

The funding provided for the W.I.S.H. Program addresses two of the issues identified by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in response to the national opioid crisis:

- Improving access to treatment and recovery services, and
- Advancing better practices for pain management.

The Amendment, effective upon signature through March 31, 2022, to ensure no gap in services during the completion of a formal procurement process for these services.

This Amendment #01 is entered into between **Project Quest dba Quest Center for Integrative Health** ("Contractor"), and Clackamas County, acting through its Health, Housing and Human Services Department, Behavioral Health Division ("County") and shall become part of the contract entered into between both parties on September 23, 2021 ("Contract"), as amended.

Justification for Amendment:

Contractor provides the Wellness, Integrity, and Sustainable Health Pain Management Program or W.I.S.H. Program. The program is an integrated medical and behavioral health program designed to treat chronic pain through the use of non-opioid interventions.

This Amendment #01 extends the term of the Contract through **March 31, 2022**, to ensure no gap in service while a formal procurement is conducted.

Compensation of this Contract is **increased by \$45,000.00** for the additional months of the service. **New contract maximum is \$135,000.00.**

This Amendment #01 is effective **upon signature** and continues through **March 31, 2022**.

Except as amended hereby, all other terms and conditions of the contract remain in full force and effect. The County has identified the changes with "***bold/italic***" font for easy reference.

If any interim payments to Contractor are made, such payments shall be made only in accordance with the schedule and requirements in **Exhibit D**.

TO READ:

3. **Consideration.** The County agrees to pay Contractor, from available and authorized funds, a sum not to exceed **one hundred thirty-five thousand dollars (\$135,000.00)**, for accomplishing the Work required by this Contract. Consideration rates are on a fixed fee basis in accordance with the rates and costs specified in **Exhibit D**. If any interim payments to Contractor are made, such payments shall be made only in accordance with the schedule and requirements in **Exhibit D**.
