EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Each fiscal year it is necessary to reduce or allocate additional sources of revenue and appropriate additional expenditures to more accurately meet the changing requirements of the operating departments. The attached resolution reflects such changes requested by departments in keeping with a legally accurate budget.

Historically, the Development Agency has had a large capital construction budget in the Clackamas Town Center district. There are very few projects remaining to be completed in this district and all known projects were accounted for and budgeted in FY 23-24. However, on September 16, 2023, one of the Agency's properties was set on fire and significantly damaged a building. Due to the level of destruction, the building became unsafe. In addition, while there was known asbestos in isolated areas of the building, the fire spread the asbestos throughout,

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thus making all of the material contaminated. This significantly increased the amount of material that needed to be abated than what was previously anticipated. An emergency amendment to an existing contract needed to be executed in order to perform the hazardous material abatement and fire debris removal. These were not anticipated costs at the time of budgeting.

This was an unplanned expense at the time of budgeting last year and there is now a need to move funds from Contingency into Capital to make sure enough funds are appropriated to cover this additional cost, as well as other expenses previously budgeted. The proposed transfer is authorized under ORS 294.463.

The effect of this resolution is an increase in appropriations of \$1,000,000.

Comments: The Clackamas Town Center Development Area Fund is reducing contingency and budgeting an increase in Capital Outlay to allow for unanticipated expenses at the time of the FY 23/24 budget preparation, including a property fire mitigation and clean up.

These changes are in compliance with ORS 294.471(1)(a) which allows for governing body approval of supplemental budget where there is an occurrence or condition that is not ascertained when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and that requires a change in financial planning, and ORS 294.471(1)(b) which permits a local government to make a supplemental budget where there is a pressing necessity that could not reasonably be foreseen when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and that requires prompt action. Change for items that differ more than ten percent of the qualifying expenditures of the budget funds being adjusted require a hearing pursuant to ORS 294.473. The required notices have been published.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully recommends the Board hold the required public hearing and consider adoption of the attached Resolution Order in keeping with a legally accurate budget.

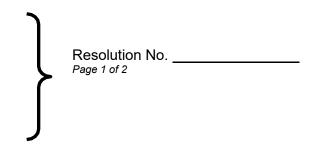

In the Matter of Providing Authorization Regarding Adoption of a Supplemental Budget for Items that Differ More Than 10 Percent and Making Appropriations for Fiscal Year 2023-24



WHEREAS, during the fiscal year changes in appropriated expenditures may become necessary and appropriations may need to be increased, decreased or transferred from one appropriation category to another;

WHEREAS, ORS 294.463(1) allows transfers of appropriations be made within a fund when they are authorized by ordinance or resolution of the governing body of a municipal corporation;

WHEREAS, ORS 294.471(1)(a) permits a municipal corporation to make a supplemental budget where is an occurrence or condition that is not ascertained when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and that requires a change in financial planning;

WHEREAS, ORS 294.471(1)(b) permits a municipal corporation to make a supplemental budget where there is a pressing necessity that could not have been reasonably foreseen when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and that requires prompt action;

WHEREAS, at the time of developing the Development Agency budget for FY 2023-2024, capital project expenses were anticipated for known projects. However, on September 16, 2023, one of the Agency's properties was set on fire, significantly damaging an existing building. An emergency amendment to an existing contract needed to be executed in order to address abatement of discovered hazardous material and disposal of fire debris. These were not anticipated costs at the time of budgeting, so funds need to be transferred from one category to another within the budgeted fund and authority granted to appropriate those reallocated funds:

WHEREAS, the Development Agency proposes to transfer dollars currently in Contingency into the Capital within the Clackamas Town Center Area Operating Fund 450;

WHEREAS, the occurrences and conditions identified above were not ascertained when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and therefore requires a change in financial planning;

WHEREAS, the occurrences and conditions identified above represent a pressing necessity that could not have been reasonably foreseen when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period and that requires prompt action;
