### **6:35 p.m. – Project Updates**

Scott went over a few bicycle and pedestrian projects the County is working on, including a new marketing video for the Clackamas Town Center area where they'll need some volunteers to ride around on the new facilities. Scott said to contact him if anyone is interested.

He also mentioned that he wants a member from PBAC to sit on an Advisory Committee for the upcoming update to the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. He'll send out info in the coming weeks to those who are interested.

### **6:40 p.m. – Safe Routes to School**

Nicole provided an update on the SRTS project at Oregon Trail Elementary School on 152<sup>nd</sup> Ave. to provide a safer street crossing. She showed a picture of a crossing guard with a handheld stop sign, as well as a sandwich board to alert drivers about the crosswalk in front of the school. Those things were purchased by the school with some grant funds. The SRTS team conducted a walk audit at Oregon Trail Elementary. They are seeking a letter of support from PBAC for the grant proposal on a project to install a Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacon (RRFB) and crosswalk improvements.

Ray made a motion to approve the letter of support with minor changes, Pete seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
