I. Wildfire Situational Awareness Preparation and Safety Presentation

- a. Top Five for Emergency Preparedness: All Equally Important
 - i. Survival necessities (food, water, shelter, cash)
 - ii. Appropriate clothes for weather
 - iii. Medications that are irreplaceable for people and pets
 - iv. Information for situational awareness, which includes ability to communicate
 - v. Relationships (family, friends, community)
- b. Communication During an Emergency
 - i. Call people who may be at risk or require more time to evacuate to make sure they are situationally aware when you receive an alert
 - ii. Use neighborhood and family group text messaging but remember cell towers may only have 3 days of stored power before they go out too.
 - iii. 2-Way FRS/GMRS or 2-Way GMRS radios/know who your local HAM operators are
- c. Know Where You are Evacuating
- d. Shelter in Place: You are Trapped
 - i. Know where your safe spots are that will not burn and go there as quickly as possible
- e. Adequate Supplies
- f. You Want to Come Home to Your House if You Evacuate
- g. National Fire Association Home Ignition Zone: 5 feet to 30 feet to 100 feet
- h. Situational Awareness: Allows you to make final preparations in advance for a wildfire



i. Be Ready: Have local firefighting ability to keep a small fire small while Fire Department is on its way

 - iii. Board Votes: 7 in favor, 0 Opposition, 0 Abstained

- a. Z0108-24 Matt & Gayle Cepica, 23061 S Bluhm Road, Beavercreek, zoned EFU, 39.86 acres, requesting to replace a 1905 farm house with a new dwelling in an EFU zone. Approved subject to conditions.
- b. Ordinance ZDO-288 Zoning & Development Ordinance Amendments Related to Utility Facilities. Planning Commission Hearing 4/8, deliberations rescheduled to 5/13. BCC 6/12.
- c. Ordinance ZDO-285 Minor & Time Sensitive Amendments & New Housing Options ADUs & RVs in Rural Residential Areas. PC Hearing 4/22, BCC 5/8. Bill Merchant testified. BCC reconsidering RV portion.
- d. Z0346-23-ZAP & Z0347-23-SL, applicant Mann Construction, property owner Enoh & Danielle Man & Cornel & Vitoria Man, 20750 S Beavercreek Road, zoned RRFF5, 56.22 acres, requesting a zone change from RRFF5 to RA2 and a 28-lot subdivision for future development of single-family dwellings. Approved subject to conditions. DLCD appealed to LUBA, Hamlet cannot intervene. HOW DO WE HANDLE FUTURE APPEALS/INTERVENSIONS? LUBA hearing 4/30. Decision remanded to Clackamas County.
